PARISH NEWS EDITORIAL

After a short break in publication, the Parish Council was able to create a completely new format magazine with the most notable feature being the introduction of colour production. This was achieved by the joint efforts of Parish Councillors, the Printers and most importantly the copy writers and Advertisers. It was a great relief to the Parish Council when Parishioners expressed their appreciation for the new format and quality of the newly created Crudwell Parish News.

There were never any initial misconceptions that a completely new concept magazine could be produced exclusively by the Parish Council without significant additional assistance from interested volunteers. It was extremely fortunate that two very enthusiastic Parishioners were able to further develop the initial successful CPN concept to its present high standard.

It is now essential that for the CPN to continue in its present format then more volunteers are needed to supplement the Management Team. We are seeking in particular volunteers with IT and desk top publishing skills to join the team although anyone with an interest in assisting us should consider contacting the Parish Council. Terms of Reference for the management of the CPN are available to anyone who would like to consider assisting us with this most valuable Parish asset. The Crudwell Parish News belongs to the Parish and is therefore jointly owned by the Parishioners. The fundamental aim for the CPN is that it should continue from its initial roots of many years ago to be delivered free of charge to every household in the Parish. This can only be achieved with the sustained contribution of dedicated volunteers. There is much media coverage this morning regarding this issue. As yet Wiltshire Council's Public Protection Service has not received any instruction from the Food Standards Agency, London directing us to take action on this issue. The FSA (Ireland) have acted swiftly to identify affected product, retailers and implicated meat processing plants. **They stress there is no health risk associated with these findings.**

CRIME UPDATE *from P. C. Steve Harvey*

There has been an increase in dwelling burglaries in the Ashton Keynes area over the last couple of months. The responsible persons have gained entry by insecure windows or prising windows open. Cash and jewellery appears to be the main target. We are working closely with detectives from our priority crime team to try and detect these offences. I cannot stress enough how important it is to call in straight away any details of persons or vehicles behaving suspiciously in your area. Some of the burglaries have been during daylight hours. If in doubt call it in on **101** if non emergency. **If happening there and then, use 999.** You can also call crime stoppers on **0800 555 111**

If you do happen to keep Jewellery in the house then I would suggest you photograph it so that if stolen we have a picture we can circulate. It would also be useful for insurance purposes.

Our priority has been 'high visibility patrols' to try and curb anti social behaviour which was raised by you in our consultations. This was a success with a reduction in most areas. We are continuing with this priority for the next quarter in response to the burglaries. However, anti social driving has also been raised by the local community as an issue therefore we will also be

targeting speeding motorists, motorists using mobile phones and motorists not wearing seat belts. We all have schools within our community and

once again at most of the schools parking is an issue. One of the reasons why parents take their children to school by car is safety. Yet a lot of those same people park their cars around the school in such a manner as to cause danger. If you are able, please walk your children to school, this saves on the parking and you can educate your children in road safety whilst on route. Most schools have locally arranged parking protocols such as at Crudwell 'The potting shed' pub car park can be used and at Minety the Rugby club car park can be used. Please contact your school for details. Can I also please remind you that Malmesbury Police have a very active facebook site with up to date news and issues. Update on Eastcourt Flooding

The Parish Council has been busy liaising with Wiltshire Council over the recent flooding across the Parish.

Due to the prolonged rain over the past year, fields and gardens have become saturated, resulting in more runoff than the ditches and drains were designed to cope with. In some areas the preventative maintenance and watercourse clearing efforts by Parishioners has kept most of the flooding at bay, but there are a few problem areas left to deal with.

Two areas which have received a lot of adverse attention recently are the Hankerton Road and Oaksey Road (by the Bridalway) in Eastcourt. Neither have traditionally had major flooding problems, but have had frequent and prolonged floods resulting from even unexceptional rainfalls over the past few months.

These areas seem to have become collecting points for all of the runoff from the fields and roads in the surrounding area. The landowners have done what they can to keep the water flowing but have discovered that the existing infrastructure simply wasn't designed to cope with the prolonged volumes of runoff we have experienced in recent months.

Wiltshire Council have visited on a number of occasions and have agreed a plan of action: In the second half of January they plan to clear the drains, pipes and

ditches through the village as well as cut new drainage channels from the roads to the ditches where required. They then wish to see the results of these actions before recommending if additional work is required, but do concede that by allowing the runoff from the roads and fields to enter the drainage system more rapidly, we may see the existing areas of concern flood more rapidly in the future.

Wiltshire Council have also been made aware of the damage done to the road surface in these areas. Please rest assured that the Parish Council will keep pushing Wiltshire Council to resolve both the flooding and pot-hole problems as quickly as possible.

GOINGS ON IN CRUDWELL IN THE THIRTEENTH CENTURY



The following story of two Wiltshire peasants told in the king's court in 1211 may be assumed to illustrate the rougher side of life in a medieval village (source, Curia Regis Rolls vi 137):

'Richard of Crudwell appeals (accuses) John Scot and says that on the eve of Our Lady's birthday three years ago, the said John came from Ashley where he had been at a scotale (an ale-drinking) and in the way

as he came from Cirencester market made Richard get up behind him on his horse, and whereas Richard had thought that he would give him a lift in good faith, he struck out his hand backwards with a knife in it and struck Richard and wounded him in the right shoulder so that he fell off the horse, and John dismounted and again struck him with the knife and gave him another wound on the shoulder higher up (and the first wound was four and a half inches deep), and left him nearly dead, and besides this robbed him of forty-three shillings in coin from his purse and of a gold ring price fifteen pence; and when he had done this, Richard went home as best he might on all fours; and on the next day, the day of S. Mary's birth, he informed the king's serjeant (Chief Constable), Robert of Hale, who came and saw the wounds and granted him the king's peace and went away; and five nights afterwards John came with his force to the house of Richard's mother in Crudwell and burgled her house and bound her and so treated her thereby. And afterwards he robbed the house and carried off whatever was therein; and on the fourth or fifth day after the burglary Richard came to his mother and found her in the said condition, and she bade him, in case of her dying before him, to prosecute her death against the said John. And all this he offers to deraign against him as the court shall consider. *Courtesy of Mr Ron Packer*

COFFEE 'N' CHAT

Cotswold Airport Advisory Group

Amongst the many consultation committees and advisory groups that members of Crudwell Parish Councillors attend is the Cotswold Airport Advisory Group (CAAG). The airfield has been in existence for many years, latterly sold into private ownership following Royal Air Force occupation. Notably it was the home base of the Red Arrows Aerobatic team during that period.

Most will know that the geographic area of the airfield is bisected, not equally, by the county borders of

Gloucestershire and Wiltshire, which has led to several administrative problems for both the Management and the two County Authorities. The CAAG is the forum for close liaison to resolve such problems in an effect manner


CAAG is Chaired by Cotswold District Council (CDC) planning officer and the following parties are represented. The Airport Manager and advisers, CDC Councillors, Wiltshire Council are represented by Minety Ward Member, the deputy Chairman is

a WC Senior Planning Officer who is supported by an Enforcement Officer, and the surrounding Parish Councils send along a representative.

Recent developments have included the completion of an Airport Management initiative to voluntarily sign a Unilateral Undertaking which details the activities that will take place within the airfield perimeter on an area of ground that lies within WC control. This document sets out a calendar of events and activities which will be strictly adhered to by the Airport Management and which will be enforced by WC who are the controlling authority. From the latest minutes we have reproduced a pie chart of activities for information. We are often asked about the employment viability of the base now in commercial ownership. Figures just released indicate 165 employed within the Airport Operational sector which contribute to a total of 388 full time jobs within the airfield boundary.




