

The Parish Council continues to monitor local Covid data and while the number of cases here and in Wiltshire continues to fall in line with the rest of the country death rates unfortunately continue to be extremely concerning. It is therefore very important to stay at home where possible and to follow local and Government guidance (see below).

Information from Wiltshire Council (the following information is as issued by the Council in its regular e-mails)

COVID-19 Roadmap

Following the announcement from central government yesterday (Monday 22 February), the COVID-19 Roadmap has been released. The roadmap explains how we plan to come out of this lockdown cautiously and safely.

It's broken down into four key steps:

- Step 1 between 8 March and 29 March
- Step 2, no earlier than 12 April
- Step 3, no earlier than 17 May
- Step 4, no earlier than 21 June

Editors Note: Details of each step are contained in an annex to this edition of What's on.

All the dates in the roadmap are indicative and subject to change. Only when the government is sure that it is safe to move from one step to the next will the final decision be made. The COVID-19 Roadmap gives us all a clear pathway out of this lockdown. However, we must not become complacent.

All of the sacrifices you have made during this time have resulted in case numbers dropping in Wiltshire, so a massive thank you for your efforts. We must all continue to play our part to stop the spread of coronavirus, as this is vital in making the transition out of this lockdown as smooth as possible. So please continue to:

- Wash your hands regularly
- Wear a face covering where required to do so
- Stay 2m apart from other people (outside of your household)

England is in a national lockdown

England entered a national lockdown on Tuesday 5 January. This means you must stay at home and only go out if it is essential. View more detailed government guidance including essential reasons to leave the home and meeting others at [GOV.UK - national lockdown](#).

PPE for Unpaid Carers

Wiltshire's eligible unpaid carers are now able to receive PPE following updated national guidance.

Wiltshire Council is working closely with charity Carer Support Wiltshire to ensure unpaid carers receive the PPE they need to keep those they care for and themselves safe. Carers can request PPE if they care for or go into the home of someone they don't live with to provide care or support.

Carers can call Carer Support Wiltshire on 01380 908008 who will provide advice and arrange for delivery of the PPE complete with instructions on how to use it and dispose of it. If you are a carer and not currently registered with Carer Support Wiltshire, we encourage you to call them and talk through whether you may be eligible for PPE and find out about other support services they offer. A carer is anyone who cares, unpaid, for a family member or friend who could not always manage without their support. They might look after someone with a physical disability, long term health condition, mental health issue or a problem with substance misuse.

COVID vaccinations for priority front-line Health and Social Care Workers

From the 11 of February for a period of 2 weeks, Health and Social Care Workers are able to book a vaccine appointment directly, via the National Booking service. This can be done via the following link:

Our online COVID-19 Business Update

Asymptomatic testing

The government has announced the rollout of asymptomatic testing (using lateral flow tests) in the community and for businesses, to enable us to target testing to people who cannot work from home during lockdown. We know how important this is for many of you, but we are currently waiting guidance from government on these tests.

Once we have it, we will promote it widely on our website, through our social media channels, and in the local media, so please do not contact us about this at present.

It's important to note that this type of testing is not something that can be used in isolation, but if used properly with other measures it can be a useful tool at our disposal to help break transmission.

'Jog on' and think carefully where you do your daily exercise

We are urging you to think carefully where you do your daily exercise and to 'jog on' if you travel too far or there's too many people.

Residents have raised concerns about large numbers of people at some of Wiltshire's beauty spots and popular areas and we're asking people to be sensible when out and about and enjoying their daily exercise. The national lockdown stay at home rules state that people should minimise time spent outside their home, but can leave home to exercise. This should be limited to once per day, and people should not travel outside their local area.

You can exercise in a public outdoor place:

- on your own
- with the people you live with
- with your support bubble (if you are legally permitted to form one)
- in a childcare bubble where providing childcare
- or, when on your own, with one person from another household

Crudwell Strawberry Fayre Open Gardens Event

It is with heavy hearts that we report the cancellation of Crudwell Strawberry Fayre 2021. The reason, of course, is the uncertainty surrounding the progress of Covid 19.

Despite the success of the vaccination programme to date we are warned that the future development of variants of the virus is not sufficiently predictable to guarantee the safety of those attending, and/or working in, the majority of space-restricted public events this summer.

All is not lost however! The Open Gardens Event we mentioned in these pages at the end of last year, which does not confine people to the intimate space of the village green, will go ahead in June.

We are mindful that the cancellation of the Strawberry Fayre for a second consecutive year will leave the church very short of the funds it relies upon for maintenance jobs needed to keep our beautiful church building in reasonable repair. Other ways of raising money must be found.

So, we are hoping that the dozens of keen (and possibly not-so-keen) gardeners who took advantage of lockdown during last summer's gorgeous weather to knock their gardens into shape will be prepared to share the results of their endeavours with others from in and around the village.

A few people, some with tiny gardens others with far larger, have so far offered to take part but we need many more, at least a total of 20 to raise a worthwhile sum for the church.

Please think of opening your garden for this event, which will take place during the afternoon of Sunday, June 13 to avoid the holiday rush that will almost certainly take place when the regulations allow. Don't wait to be asked (cajoled), please email one of the committee members below.

Neighbourhood Plan 24 February 2021

The Referendum version of the Crudwell Neighbourhood Plan plan has been registered with Wiltshire Council. Our thanks to all who have helped to achieve this, in particular our Focus Group members but also all of you who have helped us during our consultation events and surveys.

During the Covid pandemic Referendums cannot be held until at least May 2021 and we will inform you as soon as we have confirmation of the Referendum date from Wiltshire Council. We are also available to answer your questions; just a reminder also that the my-Crudwell website has a frequently asked questions section which contains comprehensive answers to many questions which parishioners have asked. This can be found at: <http://www.my-crudwell.org/plan/faqs/>.

In the meantime the Plan, having reached this stage has a great deal of strength in that it can protect us from speculative developers who may launch planning applications as Wiltshire Council land supply is below the required five years.

We believe that it will be very much in Crudwell parishioners' best interest to support the Neighbourhood Plan when it comes to the Referendum as it will help to ensure that we can control development at a pace, affordability, housing mix and design which is acceptable. If the Plan is not supported then there will be significant risk to us of large unwanted developments again being approved or imposed in addition to our site allocation at Tuners Lane.
