



Crudwell PC Covid-19 Support Arrangements

Crudwell Parish Council

The Council continues to take guidance from the National Association of Local Councils who have a dedicated web page at: <u>https://www.nalc.gov.uk/coronavirus</u>. We have continued to conduct parish business by correspondence during this period and are also considering holding virtual meetings as and when required. In the meantime, should parishioners have specific issues they can contact the Chairman <u>peter.gilchriest@crudwell-pc.gov.uk</u> or phone 577615.

The my-Crudwell website, developed with Council support, has links to many local services and provides access to the on-line What's On in Crudwell journal. It also has links to the Street Leaders support network and a my-Crudwell mailing list to keep you informed of developments.

The children's play area and outdoor gym remain closed in accordance with Government guidance and we would ask you therefore not to use these facilities.

School's out, learning's not!

Over 200 teachers and a host of well-known faces will be teaching the nation's kids, as BBC opens its doors for virtual learning.

- BBC's new Bitesize Daily service is powered by over 200 talented teachers.
- Professor Brian Cox teaches key science topics including force and gravity.
- Manchester City footballer Sergio Aguero gets the nation's kids counting in Spanish.
- Award-winning music stars Mabel and Liam Payne combine music and reading for secondary school kids.
- Doctor Who's Jodie Whittaker drops into Bitesize daily lessons.
- Hundreds of lessons will be delivered over 14 weeks.

The BBC opened its doors to its biggest ever education offer, Bitesize Daily, a few days ago, and the teaching roll call looks mightily impressive, with a register full of familiar names.

Coronavirus Job Retention Scheme

The online service to claim 80% of wages costs, up to £2,500 per month, for furloughed staff (employees who have been asked to stop working but have not been made redundant) is now open. Employers who apply by Wednesday 22 April 2020 will receive their money before the end of the month.

This is a temporary scheme in place for four months starting from 1 March 2020, but it may be extended if necessary and employers can use this scheme anytime during this period. It is designed to help employers whose operations have been severely affected by coronavirus to retain their employees and protect the UK economy. All employers are eligible to claim under the scheme.

COVID-19 Business Grant Scheme

We've received over 6,000 forms and over £50million has been paid to more than 4,300 business in Wiltshire. About 3,000 eligible businesses have still not yet applied for their grant, representing about a third of our eligible businesses. We've already contacted about 1,000 of these businesses by email or telephone, to encourage them to apply for the support that is available to them and will contact the remaining businesses in the coming days.

The grant is not a loan so it does not need to be paid back but it may make a huge difference to the future of your business.

Neighbourhood Plan 22 April 2020

The Neighbourhood Plan document set for the next consultation (called Reg 15/16) is now complete and the policies within it all agreed by the Steering Group. The Steering Group has also completed it's review of the plan which is now being processed by the Parish Council for approval. Following approval the document set will be presented to Wiltshire Council who will undertake the final public consultation (Reg 16) in a few weeks time. This will be well publicised and will extend for a minimum period of six weeks and possibly longer if lockdown is extended

It is important to progress this now in order to ensure that we can control the extent, pace, location and nature of future housing developments in Crudwell. Failure to do so could again make us extremely vulnerable to speculative planning applications and developments over which we have little control. Wiltshire Council have asked us to present Reg 16 now as this will strengthen our position. We understand that they expect to carry out this consultation and the subsequent Inspector's review but that the Referendum may be delayed by lockdown. You will be informed of how and when you can make your Reg 16 representations by our mailing list, this journal, notices posted within the village and all other means of communication available to us at that time.

Here are couple of stories about local people with children at Crudwell school who are assisting in the fight against COVID-19.

Triathlon at Home

Richard Groome from Lea, who has a child at Crudwell School, has undertaken a full Ironman Triathlon in his garden in support of Malmesbury Foodbank. He completed a 1.5hr swim in a paddling pool, a 112 mile bike ride on a static bike, and a 26.2 mile run around the garden. At times it was hard going and Richard had to overcome sickness and, no doubt, some boredom but, with determination and support from family and neighbours, he battled through to the end! Richard had hoped to raise £420 (the number of laps he had to run) but the total will be close to £3,000 all of which will be donated to the Malmesbury Foodbank which is in greater demand than ever because of the COVID-19 epidemic. Ben said "We will continue to make these as long as we can, and we are ever grateful for the kind donations and support from Miss Trevaskis and the teachers at Crudwell school, Tetbury Hardware and of course our family and friends". Ben added "William Eastlake, also from Tetbury, has kindly offered his services and is now helping to
