Whilst the latest information from the Government indicates a relaxing of restrictions on outdoor activities they also make it quite clear that we will not be able to open the playground and outdoor fresh air fitness equipment because there is a higher risk of close contact and touching surfaces. The children's play area and outdoor gym must therefore remain closed in accordance with Government guidance and we would ask you therefore not to use these facilities.

Household recycling centres to reopen with postcode entry system

All of Wiltshire's household recycling centres (HRCs), EXCEPT Stanton St Quintin, will reopen tomorrow (Monday 18 May) with an easy to use postcode entry system to help limit the number of people on site at any time and ensure social distancing. We expect the sites to be extremely busy during this initial phase of reopening, so please consider whether you really need to visit the sites during the first week or so.

Stanton St Quintin HRC will remain closed because parking spaces on site have been significantly reduced and because of the already difficult traffic management issues at the site. This will be kept under review and in the meantime you should use the Purton, Melksham or Lower Compton sites. You should only visit HRCs on the days that correspond to the first part of your postcode. For example, if your postcode starts in BA12, you can only visit the sites on Monday 18 May, Wednesday 20 May etc - see table below.



You can visit any Wiltshire site you choose, so while you are limited by the days you can attend, you can attend any Wiltshire household recycling centre on these days - though please be sure to check the latest opening times before you set off, as many sites will need to operate very differently to previous arrangements. You may be asked to provide a proof of address in order to use the household recycling centre, so please bring it with you. Here are a few FAQs to help: a full list can be found here

Is there a limit on how many people can travel in a car?

In order to ensure social

distancing is adhered to, we're currently permitting one person per vehicle. We'll review this after the initial opening period. Blue Badge holders can bring another person with them in their vehicle to unload waste - please display your Blue Badge clearly in your vehicle front window.

What are the guidelines to visit the HRCs?

You should wear your own gloves when you visit a HRC and dispose of your gloves after your visit responsibly. Please stay at least 2m away from everyone at all times. You must not attend a HRC if you are symptomatic with COVID-19 or at home shielding.

How long are the queues likely to be?

We are expecting queues to be long, potentially with waits of several hours. Please check our website and social media channels before travelling for updates.

I've seen your postcode entry system, will I need to bring proof of address to the site?

Yes. Please make sure your proof of address is clearly visible in your vehicle window. Acceptable examples include - Driver's licence, council tax bill, utility bill (paper and electronic are acceptable) or your van permit if you are travelling in one of those.

Can someone on site help me dispose of my waste?

No. Staff cannot help you move your waste so we kindly ask that you do not ask them to.

Crudwell Neighbourhood Plan Important Announcement May 2020

We are delighted to report that the Neighbourhood Plan document set for the next consultation (called Reg 15/16) was formally approved by the Parish Council on the 11th May and has been registered with Wiltshire Council for the final public consultation with you (Reg 16) in a few weeks time. This will be well publicised and will extend for a minimum period of six weeks and possibly longer if lockdown continues.

Wiltshire Council asked us to present Reg 16 now as this will strengthen our position. The plan, when made, will allow us to determine the pace and scale of future developments and to influence their location, design and affordability. Failure to achieve a made plan could again make us extremely vulnerable to speculative planning applications and developments over which we have little control.

We understand that Wiltshire Council expect to carry out this Reg 16 consultation with you and the subsequent Inspector's review but that the Referendum may be delayed by lockdown. You will be informed of how and when you can make your Reg 16 representations through our mailing list, WOIC, notices posted within the village and all other means of communication available to us at that time.
