



Not the Crudwell Bike Ride

This year, in lieu of the Crudwell 24 hr bike ride, the community of Crudwell school are taking part in 'Not the Crudwell Bike Ride'.

For the month of June pupils and friends of Crudwell School have been getting out and about on their bikes trying to clock up miles and raise sponsorship.

The original goal for the pupils was to ride a combined total of 1737 miles and get to Rome. However they have blown us away with their perseverance and resilience, cycling through wind and rain and achieved that goal within 13 days! We have now extended the tour of Europe and can't wait to see how far they get!

As things stand pupils have ridden 2382 miles and raised £644 for the Friends of Crudwell School. When combined with the adult and secondary school riders we have covered a combined distance of 5448 miles!

Pupils are working towards individual distance certificates; bronze award for cycling 7 miles (equivalent to 1 lap of the bike ride), silver for 35 miles, gold for 70 miles, platinum for 140 miles, diamond is 280 miles and white jersey award for riding a massive 420 miles.

Most important are the children's sponsorship awards. Children will receive a bronze sponsorship award for raising £10 of donations, silver for £25, gold for £50 or platinum for £100.

Information from Wiltshire Council

Single adult households can form 'support bubbles'

From Saturday (13 June), single adult and single parent households can choose one other household to form a 'support bubble'.

All those in a support bubble will be able to spend time together inside each others homes, including overnight, without needing to stay 2 metres apart. They must be exclusive, so you can't change which household you join with. If anyone in the support bubble develops symptoms, everyone in the bubble needs to self-isolate.

This is designed to help those who are most isolated by current restrictions, whilst keeping the risk of spreading the virus low. It doesn't apply to those who are shielding due to the increased risk to this group, but the government is keeping advice for those who are shielding under constant review.

Face coverings must be worn on public transport

From 15 June, it will be compulsory to wear face coverings while using public transport in England.

Bus, coach, train, ferry and aircraft passengers must wear a face covering to help reduce the spread of COVID-19.

Wherever possible people should continue to avoid public transport and walk, cycle or drive.

Registering births and notices of marriage

Wiltshire Council's registration service is working hard to allow people to attend appointments to register births, and notices of marriage and civil partnerships soon.

The government announced that birth registrations, and notices of marriage and civil partnerships could resume in England from 1 June, so long as public health guidance is implemented to ensure it is safe for residents to visit the relevant buildings.

We are in the process of putting the appropriate arrangements in place to allow people to make face-to-face appointments as soon as possible in a socially distanced, safe way.

The date of the return of the face-to-face service, and the final arrangements, will be confirmed shortly.

Book online before visiting a household recycling centre

Don't forget you now need to book a slot before visiting a household recycling centre (HRC) in Wiltshire. You can book up to three days in advance and visit any HRC.

Please arrive on time and bring ID with you to confirm your booking and in the vehicle with the registration number the slot has been booked for.

Crudwell Neighbourhood Plan Important Announcement 18 June 2020

Further to our recent update we can now confirm that Wiltshire Council are intending to carry out the final consultation (called Reg 16) on the Crudwell Neighbourhood Plan very shortly. The consultation period will run for eight weeks commencing late June until late August. The Neighbourhood Plan document set will be available for you to access on the internet, or by printed copy from Wiltshire Council. Although this consultation and following independent examination have now been authorised the Referendum when you will be asked to vote for the plan in order that it can be "made" will not take place until next year due to Government Covid 19 restrictions.

It is very important though that you are aware of this consultation and make any representations which you wish to. The plan, when made, will allow us in Crudwell to determine the pace and scale of future developments and to influence their location, design and affordability. Failure to achieve a made plan could again make us extremely vulnerable to speculative planning applications and developments over which we have little control.

You will be informed by Wiltshire Council how and when you can access the Neighbourhood Plan and make your Reg 16 representations. We will also support you through our mailing list, What's on in Crudwell, leaflets delivered to your home by our Street Leaders, notices posted throughout the village and all other means of communication available to us. The Steering Group will also be organising virtual Zoom and Q&A sessions for those who wish to engage with us.

What's happening in Braydon Brook?

We are in the process of opening up the churches within the Braydon Brook Benefice. This is such good news.

Behind the scenes we are writing Risk Assessments whilst gaining agreement from all the members of the PCC. We're cleaning and moving items in the churches, so that when we open all will be safe. We have purchased hand sanitiser, paper towels, disposal gloves, my list could go on and on.

Our aim is to have each church open for Private Prayer every Sunday from 2.30pm – 3.30pm, commencing 21st June.

The churches will look different. Areas will be roped off, toilet and kitchen facilities (for those churches which have them) will be closed, and chairs and books removed. There will be no flowers in church. Doors will be opened to avoid handles, and sanitiser will be available. Only 6 people will be allowed in at once, thus maintaining social distancing.

This pandemic and the experience of lockdown have been very painful for so many people. Our churches, when open, will be able to offer a space where we can pray, ponder and just be. Our churches are there for those who have missed the stillness and peace which these buildings can give us. I am delighted that we can soon be open once again and can serve you, the people who live in these beautiful villages. So, come and pray, if you feel able, for yourself and those you love, for our society in a time of difficulty, and for those on the front line or grieving.

For those who are unable to visit in person, Braydon Brook Benefice will continue to have regular services on Zoom and YouTube and the weekly Quiz remains.
