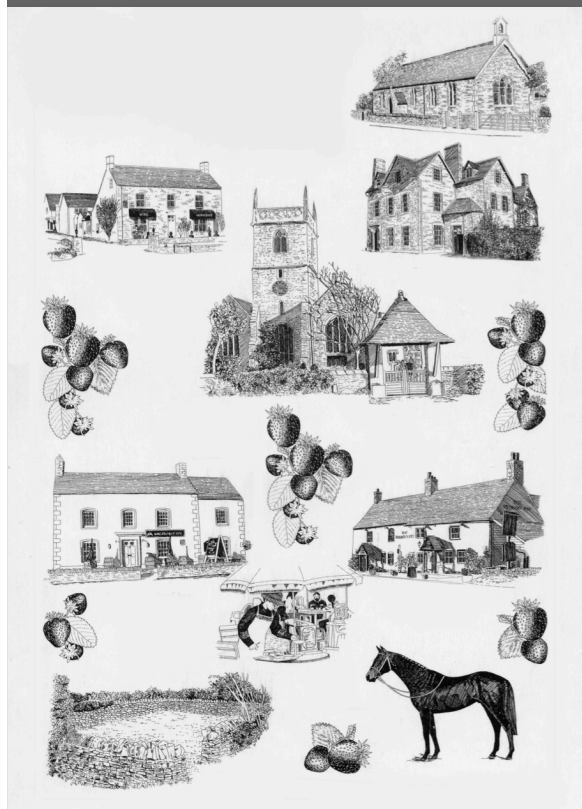

IMPORTANT NOTICE: Time to have your say!

This is a note to remind you that voting for the Crudwell Neighbourhood Plan Referendum will take place on Election Day; the 6th May 2021.

If you wish to vote, are a Crudwell Resident on the Electoral Register and have a postal vote you must submit this to reach Wiltshire Council by 10pm on election day. You can also vote in person at the polling station (Crudwell Village Hall) between 7am and 10pm on the 6th May 2021.

We have included some of our recent Frequently Asked Questions which are also available on our website.

Who created the Crudwell Neighbourhood Plan?

The plan was developed over a period of three years by a steering group comprised of unpaid volunteer Crudwell residents with the support of a paid planning consultant through funding by government grants and the Parish Council.

What is the Neighbourhood Plan doing about new housing?

The Neighbourhood Plan allocates a single site for 20-25 homes at Tuners Lane in policy DD1. The policy includes a list of requirements that the development should meet to ensure that it is safe, well designed and meets the needs that it generates. The policy seeks cooperation between the developer and the local community to work together through the planning process via the Community Liaison Group composed of Parish Councillors and Steering Group members.

What is being done about flood risk and sewage?

Policies in the plan are designed to ensure that rainwater run-off from any new site is at a lesser rate than the existing drainage. However, because of the continuing risk of flooding and sewage effluent in heavy rain, the Community Liaison Group, the Parish Council, and our Flood Warden will work jointly with the developer to ensure that Wessex Water take responsibility for and address pre-existing issues.

What happens to the Tuners Lane site if the Neighbourhood Plan does not get 'made'?

Should the referendum yield a majority 'no' vote, development at the site at Tuners Lane may proceed regardless since it has been made available as a site for development and a planning application is being prepared. However, the development will not be subject to the guidelines laid out in the Plan, including the number and type of housing, the involvement of the community liaison group, and funding for safe pedestrian and vehicle access, local amenities, and the school.

Why is the Crudwell NP allocating the Tuners Lane site?

Ten potential housing sites were suggested to the Steering Group when we asked for sites earlier in 2018. Of these, some were not available to be redeveloped before 2026, some had a capacity for fewer than 11 dwellings (so no affordable housing would be delivered on them), one was not adjacent to Crudwell village (so developing it would conflict with Wiltshire's locational strategy for new development), and one would have resulted in many more homes than are needed. This is summarised in paragraphs 6.23 to 6.32 of the Sustainability Appraisal and Evidence Base. The individual site assessment sheets are in the Design and Development Focus Group report included in the Consultation Statement at: <https://consult.wiltshire.gov.uk/resources/portal/supportingfiles/699744>.

This left only two sites that:

- Were large enough to deliver affordable homes; and
- Would deliver housing before 2026; and
- Would meet the Wiltshire Core Strategy preference for expansion of Crudwell village rather than the smaller villages and hamlets in Crudwell parish.

These sites are Tuners Lane and Ridgeway Farm phase 2.

How long does the Neighbourhood Plan last?

This version of the Neighbourhood Plan covers development in the Parish until 2026. A new Neighbourhood Plan will need to be made to cover development after that period. However, indications are that, if this version is 'made', the envisaged housing requirement to 2036 will be small and met by natural growth rather than by any imposed allocation by Wiltshire Council.

PPE for Unpaid Carers

Wiltshire's eligible unpaid carers are now able to receive PPE following updated [national guidance](#).

Wiltshire Council is working closely with charity [Carer Support Wiltshire](#) to ensure unpaid carers receive the PPE they need to keep those they care for and themselves safe. Carers can request PPE if they care for or go into the home of someone they don't live with to provide care or support.

Carers can call Carer Support Wiltshire on 01380 908008 who will provide advice and arrange for delivery of the PPE complete with instructions on how to use it and dispose of it. If you are a carer and not currently registered with Carer Support Wiltshire, we encourage you to call them and talk through whether you may be eligible for PPE and find out about other support services they offer.

A carer is anyone who cares, unpaid, for a family member or friend who could not always manage without their support. They might look after someone with a physical disability, long term health condition, mental health issue or a problem with substance misuse.

A test collection model for twice-weekly rapid COVID-19 home testing starts in Wiltshire

There are seven local test collection sites that we have opened across Wiltshire, offering the option to collect lateral flow test kits for use at home:

- Devizes Leisure Centre, which also continues to offer in-person asymptomatic testing which can be booked online
- Bourne Hill in Salisbury
- Monkton Park in Chippenham
- Springfield Community Campus in Corsham
- Calne Leisure Centre
- The Vale Community Campus in Pewsey
- Nadder Centre in Tisbury

These will open in line with the leisure centre and building opening hours so please check before you set off.

Crudwell Parish Council - continued

We will be setting up additional lateral flow test collection sites to bring the total to 10 local collection sites across the county, with the additional site locations still to be confirmed.

All of the lateral flow test collection sites around the county including our sites and pharmacies can be found on this map, which includes opening hours and the status of the site:

People can also continue to collect tests from the Salisbury Beehive Park and Ride site and the Trowbridge Greyhound Pub Car Park site, which both also offer asymptomatic testing, and more information on these sites is available on [NHS Rapid Test Collection COVID-19 Test and Vaccination Site Finder](#).

The other ways that people can access lateral flow tests include:

- a [home ordering service](#), which allows people to order lateral flow tests online to be delivered to their home, or by calling 119 between 7am to 11pm if they cannot order online
- workplace testing programmes, on-site or at home
- testing at schools and colleges

Anyone who is asymptomatic can collect lateral flow tests at the collection sites without booking.

This testing is being rolled out because around one in three people with COVID-19 do not have symptoms. Rapid lateral flow tests help to find cases in people who may have no symptoms but are still infectious and can give the virus to others.

The at home test kits are intended for use twice weekly, and results can be logged online. If the test result is positive with an at-home lateral flow test, people need to take a PCR test to confirm the result. PCR tests can be booked through www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test. If someone tests positive, they may also claim for a [Test and trace support payment](#) if they are eligible.

People who have any symptoms of coronavirus should not use this service. Symptoms include a high temperature, a new, persistent cough or a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste. Free testing continues to be available to everyone in Wiltshire who has COVID-19 symptoms, and people who show symptoms must [book a test online](#) or call 119. Testing with symptoms is offered at the regional and local testing sites.

Hello Crudwell!

We have been completely overwhelmed by the response to our fundraising for our daughter's spinal surgery abroad. Thank you to everyone who supported our Easter Egg Hunt in Crudwell over the Easter weekend. We raised a staggering £724!!! A huge thank you to those of you who also ordered pizza from The Priory when they visited the Village Hall on Good Friday and just recently on Friday 23rd April. They completely sold out on both dates and were cooking non-stop 4-8pm! They are very kindly giving us 10% of their profits from both nights, so a huge thank you to the incredible pizza and doughnut eaters of Crudwell!

By the time you are reading this, Avie and her mum Sarah will be in Philadelphia awaiting her appointment with the surgeon who hopes to confirm that he can still offer her the surgery she needs on her spine. We have been granted permission from the US Embassy to fly to America (a difficult endeavour in the present climate as we're sure you can all appreciate!). We will have to quarantine on arrival for 7 days before the appointment and then once we arrive back in the UK, we will have to quarantine for a further 10 days at home. Very frustrating (although understandable) but it will all be worth it if Avie is still deemed a suitable candidate for surgery by the hospital. If all goes well, we are probably going to be returning to the US for the actual surgery in June, as it is imperative that she has the surgery as soon as possible.

Crudwell School Teachers

Avie is now at Malmesbury Secondary School but used to attend Crudwell Primary school and her 2 younger sisters still attend there. The incredible Crudwell teachers are walking "The Cotswold Way in May" (102 miles!) to raise further funds for Avie's cause. We are so touched and will be supporting them in spirit the whole way! 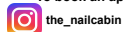
