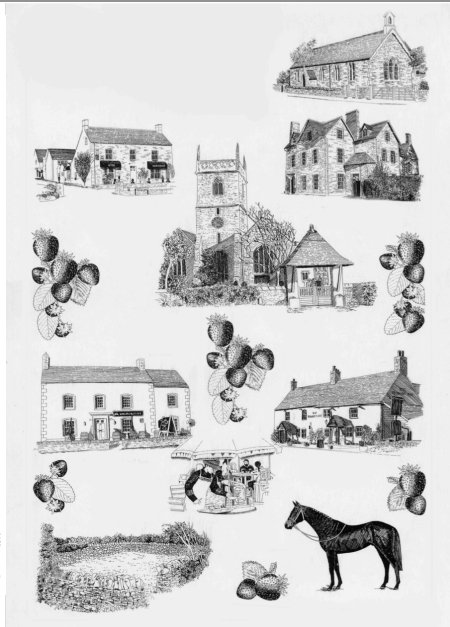

Crudwell Village Hall

Hello everyone. The Hall is open but remains subject to Level 3 restrictions that should have been lifted on June 21st but once again we must wait.

But you don't have to wait for the new web site that went live a couple of weeks ago! <https://crudwellvillagehall.org>. So far, the feedback has been great and is really appreciated. However, the aim to refresh the content and style of the old site was more than just a lick of paint.

The Village Hall is managed day-to-day by a very small volunteer operations team, three of us in fact: Treasury and Bookings secretary – Jenny, Maintenance – Richard, and the committee secretary – Bob whose duties include keeping us in line with the plethora of Covid restriction updates. (By the way, the full list of Trustees and User Representatives are on the new site).

With such a small team, identifying and implementing technological solutions to repetitive and hugely time consuming administration tasks is essential to reducing the burden of work, particularly on the accounts and booking functions. On our new site you will see that you can now book and pay securely for the Hall online. This application communicates with Jenny and feeds into our new automated accounts software, and the two systems have, so far, saved more than 6 hours per week over the legacy, manual methods of administration. So, the next time you want to book a slot you will have to use the online facility. But don't worry. There is a guide on the Booking page and all Users have commented as to how easy it is and that the User Guide is clear and helpful.

Just make sure you note the dates listed that are not available due to prior booking e.g. Pre-school days and the regular club evenings.

In other news, we welcome Crudwell Scouts leader, Tom Roberts as a new Trustee. Please check out the Scouts page on the site, especially the video!

We would like Pilates to return as an activity, but it isn't easy finding a good, qualified/registered teacher – someone like Helen who sadly left to take up a full-time job. If you know anyone who might be interested, then please get in touch.

I wonder have you ever felt hungry? Ever gone to the kitchen cupboards and found very little or nothing in them? Ever struggled to find the income to buy food for yourself and your family?

If you have ever felt like that, then perhaps you felt not only hungry, but also scared, Inadequate and desperate.

Foodbanks are a vital part of our communities, they serve those in great need and for those who receive their gifts, it really is a lifeline. Foodbanks shouldn't exist, they shouldn't be a part of a developed country, as there is more than enough to go around. But we all know that life is not fair. I wonder, are you able to help?

Gill Smith, who is the foodbank manager of Malmesbury & District Foodbank said:

Last year, food banks in the @TrussellTrust network gave out a record 2.5 million emergency food parcels to people in crisis. At Malmesbury & District Foodbank, covering villages and towns across the North Wiltshire area, we gave out 1268 food parcels with 535 of these going to children.

As reported last month the Neighbourhood Plan having passed the Referendum was 'made by Wiltshire Council and as such now forms part of the Wiltshire Council Development Plan and that it's policies will be given full weight when assessing planning applications that affect land in Crudwell Parish.

Community Liaison Group

The Neighbourhood Plan in its Housing Allocation policy DD1; Tuners Lane; requires the site promoters to work with a unique Community Liaison Group. This body, working under the auspices of the Steering Group and reporting to the Parish Council, is composed of Parish Councillors and NP Steering Group members will meet with the site promoters at key stages leading to and beyond planning application to seek to ensure that the Requirements in the policy are adhered to. The requirements will be made available on our website shortly together with progress updates.

Crudwell Open Gardens

The last time the people of Crudwell banded together to open their gardens to visitors was 23 years ago so we are hoping for a great turnout on Sunday, 4th July to raise funds for the upkeep of our historic village church.

This is a temporary substitute for the Strawberry Fayre that has been cancelled for the last two years due to Covid. A total of 16 village gardens of all shapes and sizes will be open for the afternoon, whatever the weather.

The entry fee is £7 for adults, no charge for children. You will be given a wristband for entry to all the gorgeous gardens, which will each display a poster to indicate that they are taking part.

Maps with details of where to find them all will be given out at whichever garden from which you buy your tickets. The entry fee can be paid at any of the participating gardens. Please bring cash as there will be no facility for payment by card.

The gardens will be open from 1pm to 5pm. There will be plants on sale at several of the gardens, with a general plant sale at Copperfield, 5 The Street (number 15 on the map). If you think you might buy a plant or two it would be handy to bring a carrier bag as these are in short supply these days.

Home-made teas will be available at the church, observing the Covid restrictions if still in place. Again, cash only please.

This cannot fail to be a hugely enjoyable afternoon, even if it rains. Please do come along, satisfy your curiosity about what lies beyond the garden gates, and support not only the church but also all those gardeners who have put so much effort and enthusiasm into making sure their gardens are looking their best.

Government roadmap

Restrictions are easing across the UK. The Government has confirmed there will a delay in the country moving to Step 4 of the Government roadmap, meaning that the majority of the current restrictions will remain in place for the time being. This means that the current limits on seeing friends and family will remain in place, so the rule of six or two households indoors is permitted, including for overnight stays. Restrictions on meeting outdoors will remain, with gatherings of over 30 people remaining illegal. For all the details please visit the [Government roadmap](#). In England, you can:

- meet indoors in a group of up to 6 people or a group of any size from 2 households
- meet outside in a group of up to 30 people
- Work from home if you can and travel safely
- If you have symptoms get a test and stay at home.
