

## Crudwell Parish Council - October 2021

THE next meeting of the Parish Council will take place in the Village Hall at 7:00pm on Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> October. You can attend meetings where public speaking is permitted during the first ten minutes. All agendas and minutes of the meetings are available on the Council's website at: <u>http://www.crudwell-pc.gov.uk/category/agenda/</u> As part of our routine work programme we are undertaking the following:

- We have submitted our request to Wiltshire Council for gully clearance in Crudwell, Eastcourt and Murcott.
- After 3 months on order, we have received the replacement swing seat which will be fitted by Cllr Stewart very soon.
- We will undertake our second inspection of the play equipment and fresh air fitness equipment in the next month, to ensure it remains in good order.
- The bus stop at the Wheatsheaf will have the glass replaced in the next few weeks.
- We are asking a local contractor to review the timber in place at the playground and advise us what repairs are necessary.
- We are reviewing all our assets, including small areas of fencing and walling under our care and any maintenance will be arranged.
- We are also looking at all our metal benches and if they require repainting.
- We are reviewing our website with a view to refreshing it in terms of accessibility and content to more effectively support parish activities and businesses.
- We continue to review and comment on all parish planning applications.

#### Neighbourhood Plan Report

A second meeting of the Community Liaison Group (CLG) will take place during October focussing on aspects of housing design, site layout and housing mix. The CLG will continue to meet throughout and beyond the Planning Application to help ensure that the Tuners Lane development meets the objectives of the Neighbourhood Plan. The scope of the CLG also includes the ability to seek to secure additional requirements specified in the Plan for the site and the wider community. The CLG is managed by the Crudwell Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group which in turn reports to the Parish Council who have formally agreed the group's Terms of Reference.

The group will also work closely with the Parish Council to help identify potential parish improvement schemes which could be funded by the Community Infrastructure Levy generated by the Tuners Lane development. The Neighbourhood Plan consultations gave us some indications of a local wish list and we do intend to consult with you further at the appropriate time. In the meantime, if you have ideas for improvements in Crudwell do let us know by emailing us at: plan@my-crudwell.org or community@my-crudwell.org. 
