

Many thanks to all those ladies who helped in different ways to ensure such an enjoyable morning. We were reminded of what has been missed during lockdown so look forward to welcoming even more friends and newcomers on-

Crudwell Village Hall

Things have returned pretty much to normal at the Hall, with the regular Users all returning. Tai Chi attendees are running at 14 to 15 per class, Short Mat Bowls are back in play. The Badminton Club are back but could do with some more members.

At the beginning of August, we provided a venue for the Tavern MC Classic Car Challenge that involved 70 vehicles and around 140 enthusiasts. It was very successful day, and the organisers praised the Hall as an ideal venue - and they will be back!

In the meantime, it's sad to report that there has been a small increase in petty vandalism over the last few months largely aimed at the roof! But last week we found clothes stuffed down one of the manholes that could have caused us some problems had they not been noticed in time. If this sort of problem continues, we will have to consider installing CCTV which is not desirable and should not be necessary in a village like ours.

We would just like to say thank you to those who have hired the Hall using the new booking and online payment system. It works fine for 98% of people but there are a couple of technical wrinkles we are trying to iron out with the software suppliers. This includes providing a global month-by-month view of bookings so one can see at a glance what times are available. We will aim to have sorted the current issues within the next few weeks. As reported earlier, the two systems integrate with the (new) accounting software and have saved a lot of precious voluntary time of the Treasure and Bookings manager.

Whilst talking about 'Booking', please bear in mind that at the moment, we can only take bookings for 2021. This is an accounts software issue that we are looking into. In December 2021 you will be able to book for 2022. But if you have that 'big event' for next year then please talk to Jenny or email her at **bookings@cvhrg.org.uk**

We are aware the web site takes a while to load. We believe this is due to the amount of content, but we are working to increase the speed.

Crudwell Parish Council -Covid 19 news

Although the government has now eased most restrictions in Stage 4 of the roadmap the number of infections remains worryingly high; a local rate of 229.8 cases per 100,000 as at 17th August. It is therefore extremely important to stay as safe as possible and to continue to follow advice and guidance as laid out in the Wiltshire Council section below.

Vaccine announcement for Under 18s

The Government has announced that children aged 12 to 15 who are at increased risk of serious COVID-19 disease are to be offered the Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine.

It has also been recommended that children and young people aged 12 to 17 who live with an immunosuppressed person should be offered the vaccine.

A test collection model for twice-weekly rapid COVID-19 home testing

There are seven local test collection sites that we have opened across Wiltshire, offering the option to collect lateral flow test kits for use at home:

Devizes Leisure Centre
Bourne Hill in Salisbury
Monkton Park in Chippenham
Springfield Community Campus in Corsham
Calne Leisure Centre
The Vale Community Campus in Pewsey
Nadder Centre in Tisbury

These will open in line with the leisure centre and building opening hours so please check before you set off.

We will be setting up additional lateral flow test collection sites to bring the total to 10 local collection sites across the county, with the additional site locations still to be confirmed.

Neighbourhood Plan Report

At a recent meeting of the Steering Group Sian Burke-Murphy stood down as the Chair. We are hugely indebted to Sian who's drive, dedication and energy was vital to the Plan's initiation and progress through to its successful outcome. We are delighted that Sian will continue as a Steering Group member to help with the work of the Community Liaison Group (CLG).

Cllr. Roy Lambley who led on the later stages of the Plan and the Referendum was elected as Chair, Parish Council Clerk Lisa Dent was elected as Secretary and John McWilliam (our Flood Warden) was co-opted as a Steering Group member.

A second meeting of the CLG will take place during September. This second meeting will concentrate on aspects of housing design, site layout and housing mix. The CLG will continue to meet throughout and beyond the Planning Application to help ensure that the Tuners Lane development meets the objectives of the Neighbourhood Plan in respect of housing design, mix and affordability. The scope of the CLG also includes the ability to seek to secure additional requirements specified in the Plan for the site and the wider community. The CLG is managed by the Crudwell Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group which in turn reports to the Parish Council who have formally agreed the group's Terms of Reference.

The group will also work closely with the Parish Council to help identify potential parish improvement schemes which could be funded by the Community Infrastructure Levy generated by the Tuners Lane development. The Neighbourhood Plan consultations gave us some indications of a local wish list and we do intend to consult with you further at the appropriate time.
