

Neighbourhood Plan Report

Community Liaison Group

THE Community Liaison Group of Steering Group members and Councillors is currently waiting for a date for the next iteration of discussions from the Tuners Lane promotors. It is anticipated that this will be held early in the New Year and will further agree the design, housing mix and layout of the site prior to the planning application stages.

There will also be discussions on the additional requirements for the site and the village which were defined in the Neighbourhood Plan.

Neighbourhood Plan Review

Following discussions with Wiltshire Council, the Parish Council has agreed to consider commencing work next year on a formal Neighbourhood Plan Review. It is important that Plans are routinely reviewed in order to maintain control of development in the village and prevent unwanted speculative planning applications. This is particularly relevant while Wiltshire Council continues to have a deficit in the required 5 year housing supply.

The Steering Group's Terms of Reference have therefore been updated to accommodate the Review and agreed by the Parish Council.

A Steering Group workshop is planned for the New Year during which we will develop a scope of work based on the NP Review triggers and the deferred elements of the 2021 Made Plan. This initial work will enable an estimate of the technical support required for the Review to be developed.

Further to this the Steering Group will seek the PC's formal support for the Plan Review and if approval is granted seek funding for the Review. As with the current 'made' Neighbourhood Plan, you will be consulted at the appropriate stages of the process.


Short Mat Bowls Club


