

We are aware that some streets are arranging their own street parties, just please let us know so that we can build them into the programme.

#### Car and vehicle display on the playing fields to include village photograph.

We are in touch with some clubs who will support us and to make this happen we need help with:

Putting up the marquee and setting up; providing a bar; providing pop up food stalls; inviting vehicle owners or book in and bring your own classic, interesting or just very special car, motorbike or other vehicle; registration and arrangement of vehicles; turn up for the event and for the village photograph.

Leading up to and during the event we are organising a **grand raffle** with some great prizes. We propose to split the proceeds with our Church, school and Wiltshire Air Ambulance who will be attending our main events. The draw will be held during our Village Hall event on Sunday 5 June pm. For this to work we need you to:

Distribute raffle tickets; sell raffle tickets; buy raffle tickets and win some big prizes.

This will all be alongside the Crudwell School celebrations and street parties so we are sure you will agree there is something for everyone.

#### Neighbourhood Plan Review

THE TASK of developing an outline plan for the new work streams for the Plan Review to 2040 is now in hand. This will allow the effort and technical support needed to deliver the Review to be estimated. The Steering Group will seek the PC's formal support for the Review in May and, if approval is granted, seek funding by way of Government grants.

As with the current 'made' Neighbourhood Plan, parishioners will be consulted and involved at all the appropriate stages of the process in order to ensure that the Review fully reflects the wishes of the Crudwell community.

The review will enable us in Crudwell to continue to ensure that future developments in the village are at a sustainable scale, affordable and designed to harmonise with the village scene.

#### **Community Liaison Group**

No further update this month as we are still waiting for the Tuners Lane site promotors to report back to us with their latest revised design and site layout proposals. This liaison work is important to ensure that the layout, design and affordability of the dwellings proposed meets our requirements as detailed in our Neighbourhood Plan 'made' in May 2021.


