Platinum Jubilee

The Parish Council supported four events to celebrate the Sovereign's Platinum Jubilee from 2-5 June 2022. This included a grand Jubilee Raffle. We are pleased to report that a net sum of over £1800 after expenses was raised by the sale of raffle tickets and by way of donations. Three cheques of over £600 each were handed over to our charities by Parish Councillors with the help of the school children at the school's celebration worship Service on 15 July. Neighbourhood Plan Report

The Community Liaison Group (CLG) met with the site promotors on 5 July. The purpose of the meeting was to update the CLG with Tuners Lane development pre-application discussions with Wiltshire Council. The proposed site layout had been slightly modified to meet with Wiltshire Council's planning officials' requirements, but the plot footprint remains unchanged.

The CLG agreed to comment on the proposed layout by the end of July and to take the current proposals to the Parish Council during the August meeting. The promotors hope to be able to submit a planning application by the end of this year. It was agreed that the CLG will meet further with the promotors as draft plans progress and report progress back to the PC. When plans are at a more advanced stage it is the intention of the CLG to consult with Crudwell residents and in advance of the site promotors consultation to provide an early opportunity for comment. Watch this space!

We have now commenced our application for Locality Grants to support initiation of work on the Neighbourhood Plan Review. The scope of the work for the review will include new policies in respect of: Housing Allocation of small infill and self-build sites following a call for sites; green spaces including the greens and Glebe Fields; hedgerows and green corridors; business development including a community hub. There will be full community engagement and consultation throughout the process which could take up to two years to complete.

The musicians and singers, the cake bakers and stall-holders, the transport vehicle providers, the members of the church flower group, those who lent their wedding dresses, the school children who sang and contributed artwork for the church, the generous local businesses that donated raffle prizes, those who lent their precious cars and tractors for the motor show, the photographers who recorded events for posterity, those who ran the bars in the church and the village hall, the band of organisers who cajoled and encouraged their friends to help out, plus everyone in the village who attended the various activities and bought raffle tickets – all made the celebrations a truly memorable weekend. The chairman of the parish council, Cllr Peter Gilchriest, presented the cheque for the church to church warden Helen Dawson. Cllr Alex Stewart presented the cheque to John Martin of Wiltshire Air Ambulance and Cllr Lambley presented the final cheque to Ben John, head teacher of Crudwell Primary School.

Congratulating all who took part in the Jubilee celebrations in the village, Cllr Lambley said: "While we are pleased to donated proceeds to charity, the more important benefit of the weekend was to witness the great community of Crudwell out and about and enjoying themselves together."




Ladies Lunch Club
