

Become a Parish Councillor

Why become a parish councillor?

You become someone your community will look to for help, guidance and support and a community leader with the power to influence decisions for the benefit of the people you serve. Seeing your community change for the better, due to decisions and activities you are involved in, is something that can provide a sense of achievement and pride!

What decisions do parish councils make?

These include planning matters (as statutory consultees), road safety, crime prevention and neighbourhood watch, managing open spaces including play areas and campaigning for and improving services and facilities. As a councillor, you will be part of the decision making process.

How much time does it take up?

Crudwell Parish Council meets once a month for the council meeting, to which members of the public are also invited, on the third Tuesday of the month. Meetings may last up to two hours, depending on the business for the meeting. In addition to regular meetings, there may be occasions where councillors are required to attend other meetings or events representing the council.

Neighbourhood Plan

WE BELIEVE that it is extremely important to commence a Neighbourhood Plan Review now. This is because while Wiltshire Council continues to have a land supply deficit, we could again be vulnerable to speculative planning applications for large housing developments, as the protection of our current Plan, made in 2021 could start to become less certain during 2023. The Parish Council has therefore secured additional specific resources to start work on the Review immediately. A full meeting of the Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group took place on 8 November. At this meeting the following actions were agreed to prepare for a consultation during early 2023: to develop three main topics for the Review which are: Housing Allocation: *To include a call for sites for small self-build or infill.* Business Development: *To include review of requirements for local businesses including Kemble Business Park.* Environment and Community; *To include green spaces and corridors, footpaths, hedgerows, and a community hub or similar.* The 2001 Made Plan reports will be reviewed to confirm existing policies or prepare consultation. The Plan will retain flexibility in terms of housing allocation to allow for any variation in requirement from the emerging Wiltshire Council local plan.

Following the first public consultation in early in the year we are planning for a formal consultation (called Reg 14 consultation during Q2 2023. Building on the substantial work done on the 2021 Plan we can go more quickly from there than we did then, so our outline timetable is, roughly: Examination – Q1 2024; Referendum/Plan Made – Q2/3 2024

We will inform you when we have news of the site promotor's progress on the Planning Application which will be subject to the CLG's initial review and approval.


