

Become a Parish Councillor

Help your community change for the better, become a Crudwell Parish Councillor

A parish council is a local authority that makes decisions on behalf of the people in the parish. It is the level of government closest to the community and as such, parish councils are often the first-place people will go with concerns or ideas. They are a vital part of any community.

Why become a parish councillor?

You become someone your community will look to for help, guidance and support and a community leader with the power to influence decisions for the benefit of the people you serve. Seeing your community change for the better, due to decisions and activities you are involved in, is something that can provide a sense of achievement and pride!

What powers do parish councils have?

They have a wide range of powers relating to local matters, we look after open spaces and gardens, allotments, play areas, bus shelters and grass cutting amongst other things. The council also has the power to raise money through taxation, and this is called the precept. The precept is the parish council's share of council tax.

What decisions do parish councils make?

These include planning matters (as statutory consultees), road safety, crime prevention and neighbourhood watch, managing open spaces including play areas and campaigning for and improving services and facilities. As a councillor, you will be part of the decision making process.

Parish councils have limited powers to make decisions but can negotiate with, and have the power to influence other organisations that do make final decisions (district councils, health authorities, police and crime etc).

How much time does it take up?

Crudwell Parish Council meets once a month for the council meeting, to which members of the public are also invited ON THE THIRD Tuesday of the month. Meetings may last up to two hours, depending on the business for the meeting. In addition to regular eetings, there may be occasions where councillors are required to attend other meetings or events representing the council.

How long does a parish councillor serve for?

Once elected, parish councillors sit on the council for a maximum of four years and if they wish to continue they can stand for re-election. Crudwell Parish Council currently has six serving parish councillors and three vacancies.

Am I eligible to be a parish councillor?

There are eligibility requirements and you will have to agree to follow a Code of Conduct. The Clerk can provide further information.

Neighbourhood Plan Report

Neighbourhood Plan Review

FOLLOWING Parish Council authorisation and the full Steering group meeting held in November, work has now commenced on the Crudwell Neighbourhood Plan review. The Parish Council will be updated monthly on progress, and we will report significant progress and events in this journal monthly.

As we stated in last month's WOIC it is extremely important to commence a Neighbourhood Plan Review now because while Wiltshire Council continues to have a land supply deficit, we could again be vulnerable to speculative planning applications for large housing developments.

The three main topics for the Review are: Housing Allocation: *To include a call for sites for small self-build or infill.* Business Development: *To include review of requirements for local businesses including Kemble Business Park,* Environment and Community; *To include green spaces and corridors, footpaths, hedgerows, and a community hub or similar.*

Public meetings and an exhibition will take place during the consultation. The Plan will retain flexibility in terms of housing allocation to allow for any variation in requirement from the emerging Wiltshire Council local plan.

We are currently preparing an initial consultation questionnaire to seek your views on the above topics, this will be made widely available in early 2023 both on our website and in paper copies throughout the village. Watch this space! There will be full community engagement and consultation throughout the process which is expected to be completed in the summer of 2024.

Community Liaison Group, (CLG) Tuners Lane Development

We understand that revised plans which are likely to be more in keeping with the CLG's requirements are currently being prepared by the site promotors. We will consult further with you when these are available for review.


North Wiltshire Villages Flower Club
