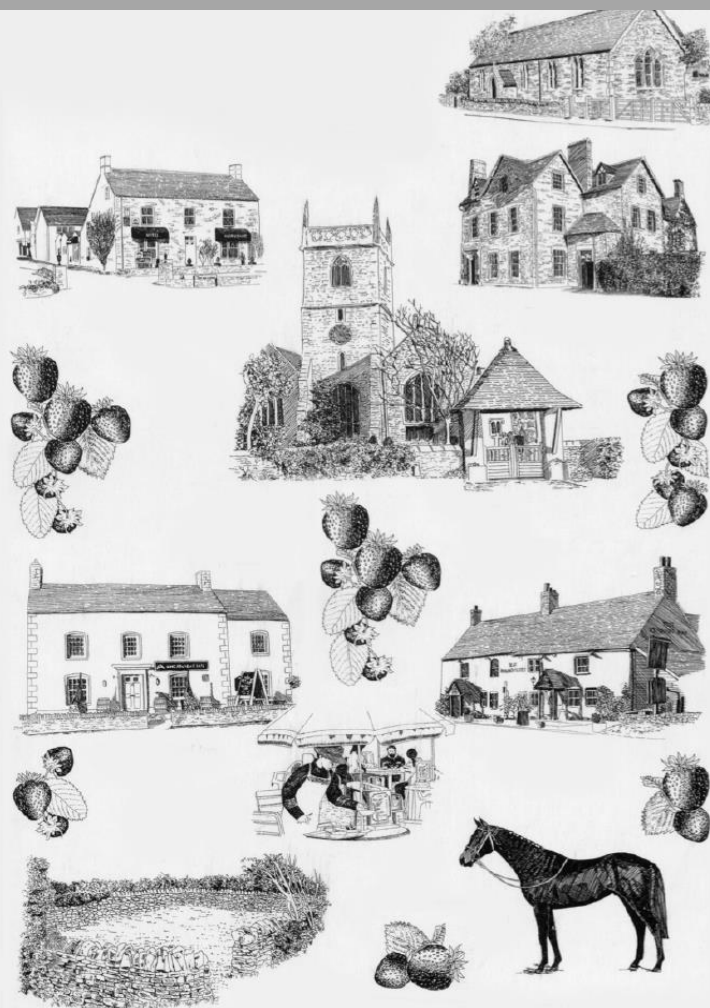

Crudwell Jubilee Celebrations

WHAT a weekend we have ahead of us as Crudwell joins the nation's celebration of the 70 glorious years that Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II has been on the throne! Crudwell events kick off with a **Musical Evening** starring local singers and musicians on **Friday 3rd June at 7pm** in our lovely **parish church** of All Saints. We have been fortunate that some truly talented singers and musicians have volunteered to perform for this evening.

Those of you lucky enough to have heard Sam Unwin (singer), Kelly James (piano), Ian Duffin (singer) and John Hughes (piano & organ) perform will know just what a treat we are in for. Crudwell Primary School choir has also been rehearsing hard and will be contributing two songs entirely appropriate for the occasion.

There is no set charge for the evening (donations on the night will be greatly appreciated) but in order for us to cater for numbers at the interval drinks we would really like the anticipated audience members to please pick up tickets either from the Post Office at the Wheatsheaf (Monday and Tuesday mornings, Wednesday afternoons) or from the volunteers who will be knocking on your doors.

It is expected that the whole evening will last about 90 very special minutes. For those of you who cannot pick up tickets in advance they will be available at the door.

There will also be live music the following day, **Saturday 4th June**, at the **Street Party** on the **village green** from **11am to 6pm**. Bring your picnic along at any time during those hours, enjoy a glass of Prosecco from the bar and a slice of home-baked cake from the cake stall, relax, listen to the music and get to know your neighbours better. There will be a marquee in case of rain.

The church will be open from 9am on the Saturday and Sunday for the **display of wedding dresses** from former Crudwell brides. If you missed the popular exhibition a few years ago this is your chance to see just how beautiful the dresses are.

On **Sunday 5th June**, there is a **classic car and tractor display**, plus a beer tent, at the village playing fields from **10am to 4pm**. A chance to wander round a collection of vehicles with a glass of beer in your hand and compare notes with fellow enthusiasts before gathering for the **village photograph** outside the village hall at **4pm**.

The photograph will be taken from on high by professional photographer Lee Niel of Tuners Lane and is the opportunity to be included in a permanent reminder of this historic national and village event. Please try to make it, it won't be the same without you!

Finally, a plea for everyone to buy **Jubilee Raffle** tickets that are on sale from almost every outlet in the village as well as from volunteers knocking on your door. At just £1 each there will almost never be better odds of winning the £200 top prize! Proceeds to the school, the church and Wiltshire Air Ambulance. Be lucky.

Thank you to all those who have already done so much to help in the running of the above. Now all we need is for the people of Crudwell to join in at the weekend and make it a celebration to remember.

WE hope you are enjoying the beautiful weather; we certainly are by spending most of the day in our garden. The outdoors provides so many learning opportunities plus health benefits for the children. Having our own private garden plus being surrounded by fields enables us to use the natural environment in so many ways. We have recently read 'The Stick Man' by Julia Donaldson. The children loved this story, they then collected sticks and natural resources from the field and our garden and made their own stick man story. The children have also made a cake mixture using the leaves in the garden, icing using mud and water and created an oven by utilising a chair in the playhouse.

The children going to school this year have been really enjoying the phonics class we offer at Pre-School. This is introduced through song, which supports a child's learning and retention. We have also been focusing on colours through matching games and hide and seek games.

We only have 3 spaces left for children aged from 2 to 5 years, we also offer 2-year-old government funded and 15-hour government funded spaces for children.

26 May - Alfred Williams and the Folk Songs of the Upper Thames by Martin Graebe.

Alfred Williams was born in South Marston, Wilts, in 1877. He wrote poetry and about the people and the area in which he lived, in publications such as *A Wiltshire Village*, and *Round About the Upper Thames*. When ill-health forced him to leave his job on the railway, Alfred began cycling around the Cotswolds and Upper Thames to compile an anthology of the songs of local people. In this presentation Martin Graebe will talk about Alfred Williams ' life and work with particular reference to his folk songs. The talk will be illustrated with photographs and performances of some of the songs discovered by Williams.

23 June - A Ride Round England: one man, one horse, 2,700 miles and 30 cathedrals by William Reddaway. This talk is about a long ride William embarked on as a retirement project between 10 May and 8 December 2013. He travelled on a form of transport for which all the infrastructure has long disappeared, which is interesting.S
