

## Parish Council and Covid 19 Report

The next meeting of the **Parish Council** will take place in early May. It will <u>not</u> be held on Tues 3<sup>rd</sup> May (first Tuesday of the month) so please check our website for details. Public speaking is permitted during the first ten minutes. The Parish Council is supporting a number of events to celebrate the Sovereign's Platinum Jubilee from 2-5 June. To see how you can contribute, help or take part please see the article on pages 4 and 5.

#### Covid 19

The number of infections in Malmesbury, Crudwell and Oaksey is 499.9 cases per 100,000 and the total case numbers are becoming lower but we still urge caution. You can check out the current position at: www.coronavirus.data.gov.uk/search?postcode=SN16+9ET.

#### Advice in England has changed

While you're no longer required by law to self-isolate if you have COVID-19, you should still stay at home and avoid contact with other people. This helps reduce the chance of passing COVID-19 on to others. This advice was updated on 18 April 2022.

#### When to stay at home

You should stay at home and avoid contact with other people if you have any of the main symptoms of COVID-19; have tested positive for COVID-19 – this means you have the virus. If you have any of the main symptoms of COVID-19, you should also get a PCR test to check if you have COVID-19 on GOV.UK as soon as possible. There's further advice if you're eligible for new COVID-19 treatments.

#### How long to stay at home

If you have COVID-19, you should stay at home while you're infectious to others. This can be for up to 10 days from when your symptoms start. Many people will no longer be infectious to others after 5 days. You can do a rapid lateral flow test from 5 days after your symptoms started (or the day you had the test if you do not have symptoms) and another the next day. If both tests are negative and you do not have a high temperature, you're less likely to pass COVID-19 to others and you can go back to your normal routine. If your test result is positive on day 5, you can carry on doing rapid lateral flow tests every day until you get 2 negative test results in a row.

THE Queen's Jubilee weekend (2-5 June) is almost upon us and we are still looking for kind souls to lend a hand with the events planned for Crudwell. Please will everyone take a look at the programme outlined below to see if you can spare a few hours to help make the weekend in the village a joyous and enthusiastic celebration of Her Majesty's momentous 70-year reign. If you can't spare time for anything else, please do turn up for the village photograph.

#### **Musical Evening in the parish church**

An evening of musical entertainment on Friday, 3 June at 7pm, featuring local musicians and singers. We already have some artists lined up, including the school choir, and we could do with a bit of help with the following:

- Setting up the church sound system
- Setting up the church beforehand and putting away at the end
- Your attendance on the evening, which is free and includes interval drinks but donations will be greatly appreciated.

#### Display of wedding dresses

This will take place in the church throughout the weekend, provided or course, there are people who would like to put their dresses on display, together with their wedding photographs. We are looking for the following:

- People to display their own wedding dress and photograph
- The loan of mannequins or dressmakers' dummies for the weekend
- A display co-ordinator.

#### Street party on the village green

This is planned for Saturday 4 June from 11am to 6pm on the village green by the school. There will be music, a marquee, a Prosecco bar, a cake stall, chairs and tables (similar in layout to the Strawberry Fayre which has been deferred until 2023 to accommodate the jubilee and other village events this year).

The idea is to bring a picnic for you and your family and enjoy the atmosphere and company of others from the village at a time to suit you. In the event of rain, a marquee will be in place. As with the Strawberry Fayre in the past, many willing hands are needed for the setting up of this event, including:

- Collecting, transporting and setting out of tables and chairs
- Providing and setting up a gazebo for the musicians stage
- Offers to bake cakes, biscuits etc for cake stall
- Returning tables and chairs to storage.

## Crudwell Jubilee Celebrations

#### Classic car display and Village Photograph

On Sunday 5 June a range of classic and other interesting cars and vehicles will be on display on the village playing fields from 10am. A number of individuals and clubs have been approached but you may know of others with interesting car or bikes who might like to take part. Please let us know if this is the case.

There will be a bar, food stalls and at the end of the event (approx. 4pm) there will be a village photograph. We are hoping for as many people from the village as possible to turn up for the photograph. As with the other events, some help is needed as follows:

- Registration and arrangement of vehicles

#### Jubilee Raffle

We are short of the 35% target, so whatever you think **please take the time to complete the questionnaire** - there is no age restriction to participation. You can complete it online and it takes less than a minute.



## A Message from the Archdeacon of Malmesbury

I AM very grateful to the Rev'd Tonya Nixon for her ministry as Rector of the Braydon Brook Group since 2019. Very soon after she arrived we were plunged into Covid, and Tonya has guided and pastored the benefice with great diligence, commitment and compassion. Her skills in creativity, community outreach and schools work have been greatly valued, and we wish her and Mark well in their new home in Portishead. As we approach the vacancy there are inevitably a mixture of feelings and, quite rightly, a wish for clarity. This update sets out the next steps.

The Vacancy Team of churchwardens (or equivalent for each parish) and licensed ministers have met with me. The Benefice Administrator, Alison Withers, will be the point of contact during the vacancy. Alison will arrange baptisms, weddings, funerals, the service rota and benefice administration, and requests for pastoral visits should also go to her at <a href="mailto:bbbandgb@gmail.com">bbbandgb@gmail.com</a> or 01666 825019. Decisions will be made by the Vacancy Team, supported by the Area Dean, Rev'd Steve Wilkinson (rector@woodbridgegroup.co.uk 01249 723733) and me.

The Bishop and I are committed to appointing a new Rector for Braydon Brook and we are aware that a vacancy makes significant demands on all our volunteers. So it is important that no vacancy lasts longer than it needs to. I will be liaising with the patrons.

When we advertise, potential applicants will be aware that the last two incumbents moved on within three years. We must be able to say, with confidence, that Braydon Brook is a place where the next Rector can thrive in their ministry. To do that, we need to be clear that we have considered prayerfully any issues there may be, and have clear steps to address them.

I am pleased that the Rev'd Douglas Holt has agreed to conduct a vacancy review. Douglas has great wisdom and insight, and will be able to help you reflect together on what has been, and look forward to what can be. His focus will be on meeting 1:1 with churchwardens, headteachers, licensed ministers, people with responsibility for different areas of benefice life, and representatives from each church.

He will want to know what has been good over the past few years and what strengths exist to build upon; also if there is anything that needs to change so that we can recruit a new Rector with confidence.

He will take several services during the vacancy, at which there will be an opportunity for anyone to meet him and talk, but he will not be acting as an interim Rector. Diocesan Support Services are here to help the benefice, so please keep in touch.

I look forward to our ongoing conversations and hopefully being able to join you in worship.





**May 26:** Alfred Williams and the Folk Songs of the Upper Thames, Martin Graebe Alfred Williams was born in South Marston, Wilts, in 1877. He wrote poetry and about the people and the area in which he lived, in publications such as *A Wiltshire Village*, and *Round About the Upper Thames*. When ill-health forced him to leave his job on the railway, Alfred began cycling around the Cotswolds and Upper Thames to compile an anthology of the songs of local people.

In this presentation, Martin Graebe will talk about Alfred Williams' life and work with particular reference to his folk songs. The talk will be illustrated with photographs and performances of some of the songs discovered by Williams.
