

Parish Council

THE Parish Council last met on Tuesday 27 September in the Village Hall. This meeting followed the Crudwell Parish Proclamation of the Accession of King Charles III by the Council Chairman witnessed by Councillors and parishioners. <u>http://www.crudwell-pc.gov.uk/category/agenda/</u> together with the agenda for the next meeting which will take place at 7:00 PM on Tuesday 15 November in the Village Hall. Public speaking is permitted during the first ten minutes of the meeting and you are, if you wish, able to attend.

The Queens Green Canopy

We have been informed that Crudwell will receive 15 mixed trees as part of the late Sovereign's Green Canopy initiative to mark her Platinum Jubilee. It is intended that the trees will be planted in public spaces around the parish. If you would like to nominate a public space for one or more of the trees, then please email the Parish Clerk at parish.clerk@crudwell-pc.gov.uk. If you do so you will be asked to either water the tree periodically through next summer or to ensure that you nominate someone who agrees to do so. A small group has been established to oversee tree placement and planting.

Neighbourhood Plan Report

Neighbourhood Plan Review

WE are pleased to report that, having received confirmation that our application for Government Locality Grants for our Neighbourhood Plan Review was successful, the Parish Council agreed at its September meeting that the Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group should begin work. A Steering Group meeting is being held in the first week of November to scope and prepare for a public consultation which it is anticipated will take place later this year. The review is vital to ensure that we continue to maintain our protection from large speculative planning applications beyond 2023, while Wilshire Council continues to have a housing land supply deficit.

The scope of the work for the review will include new policies in respect of:

- Housing Allocation of small infill and self-build sites following a call for sites.
- Protection of Green spaces including the village greens and Glebe Fields
- Hedgerows and green corridors
- Protection of our school
- Business development including a community hub

There will be full community engagement and consultation throughout the process which may take up to two years to complete.

Community Liaison Group, Tuners Lane Development

We understand that the Tuners Lane site promotors are undertaking a significant review of draft plans for their development in order that they are more in keeping with the Community Liaison Groups requirements. The requirements were based on the consultation with parishioners which took place during the drafting of the current 2021 Crudwell Neighbourhood Plan. When agreed plans are at a more advanced stage, it is the intention of the CLG to consult with Crudwell residents in advance of the site promotor's consultation to provide an early opportunity for comment. Watch this space!


