Exciting times at the village hall. While you'd notice there's already been some new trees planted (providing cover near the outdoor gym and tennis courts), we're also close to our next phase of developing our 'park' with more wildflower, shrub, and tree planting planned at the bottom end of the field before Christmas. Thanks so much to Hilary Warner for leading this work.

Meanwhile, it's time the 5-a-side goals had an update. New goals are being ordered and those too should be with us before winter properly sets in. We'll also be sure to have the new full-sized pitch marked out and goal nets in place before the annual Boxing Day free-for-all.

We're finally upgrading the sound system. New speakers, mics, and amplifiers have arrived and will soon be in place to provide the regular clubs and ad-hoc parties with some much-improved audio. Thanks to Tom Roberts who has helped us source the best solution.

Last, having looked again at the numbers this month, it turns out we're making really good progress towards the funds we'd need to build a bicycle pump track. We'll need some assistance from grant funding but, with another 24-hour-bike ride in the bank, and some concerted fundraising in 2026, we'll be getting very close. As a result, next year at the village hall could be all about the return of community fun nights to bring as many of us together as possible and to give the coffers an extra boost.

Crudwell Flood Action Group

Members of Flood Action Group attended the 2nd second South Cotswolds Flooding Summit at the RAU on Saturday 18 October. MP Roz Savage and her team shared their progress engaging with public bodies and agencies to make them more accountable. Jenny Phelps MBE from the Farming & Wildlife Advisory Group (FWAG) recommends an integrated local delivery approach. We'd like to talk to local farmers directly, in order to understand their priorities and work as a more joined-up community.

Crudwell PC recently funded and installed a new 2-metre depth gauge that we asked for after the Storm Bert floods. It is sited on the upstream side of the road bridge and gives us an important measurement that previously was only guesstimated. The FLAG continues to meet regularly and is collaborating ever closer with the PC on maintenance and infrastructure matters. The group will be providing a map to the Wiltshire's Principal Drainage Engineer to indicate locations where simple improvements would reduce water on roads and the flood risk to property. Please contact the group if you need any flood prevention advice or want to be more involved.

As you will have seen from last month's WOIC it is now just over one year since the Council took over responsibility for the publication of the journal. This was done as it perceived WOIC as a vital means of communication in the community and we had therefore for some years subsidised the printing costs. We were able to relaunch thanks to Katie Hawkins, our volunteer editor, and Charlotte Bullock with her team of distributors. One year on we are incredibly pleased to report that rather than making a loss, the journal now breaks even mainly thanks to Katie's enthusiastic marketing and her recruitment of several new advertisers. So, a big thank you to Katie, Charlotte and the distribution team for their great voluntary work!

Neighbourhood Plan November

2031 Neighbourhood Plan Allocation; Tuners Lane

The Planning Application for this site which was allocated in the 2021 made Crudwell Neighbourhood Plan remains under consideration by Wiltshire Council.

2038 Neighbourhood Plan Review

The Crudwell Design Code and Guide which forms part of the Reg 14 document set for inclusion in the new Neighbourhood Plan has been completed. The Code was developed in consultation with us by consultants via a government call-off contract at no cost to the Parish Council. A link to this important document which includes instructions and guidance to developers of new dwellings or extensions to existing homes in Crudwell, is now available on our website at https://www.my-crudwell.org/content/uploads/2025/08/250723_Crudwell-DDC_FINAL_LR.pdf

We received notification from Wiltshire Council that a Strategic Environmental Assessment will be required for our proposed site allocations. This document is an important part of the Neighbourhood Plan which helps to ensure that environmental considerations are integrated into public sector decision-making to promote sustainable development. This technical document is being developed by expert consultants via a government call-off contract at no cost to the Parish Council.

Our working group have examined and compared details and draft plans for three housing sites offered for allocation to determine their potential sustainability, deliverability, and suitability. Steering Group members have now requested that we should share information on these sites with you on the basis that we promised that we would keep you informed at all stages of the new Neighbourhood Plan's development. This is not at this stage a formal consultation, but we would value your informal views of the proposed allocations. We must allocate up to 39 new houses in Crudwell in order to meet the new government housing targets. If we do not do this and complete our new Neighbourhood Plan, we will be at serious risk of facing much larger unwanted speculative applications from developers given the poor housing supply position of Wiltshire Council. The sites proposed are:

- **Site A: a development of 25 homes at the north of Chapel Close.**
- **Site B: a development of 14 homes on the current Carpenters Yard site.**
- **Site C: a development of 40 homes on land to the south of Tetbury Lane between The Butts and the village playing fields.**

A short questionnaire will be made available soon via our website where you will be invited to give your informal views on the proposed sites.

The Steering Group will determine which of these sites is likely to be the best sustainable and deliverable allocation to fulfil our requirement for 39 homes and will formally consult on that in the Reg 14 consultation early in the new year.

Neighbourhood Plan continued:

A meeting with the representatives of the Parish Council, School Governors, Headteacher, Crudwell Church and residents took place on the 24th of September. The purpose was to discuss the response from Wiltshire Council concerning draft proposals to improve access and provide additional parking facilities. The proposals are in response to residents' requests to ease traffic congestion and hazards at school drop off and pick up, and to enable safer pedestrian access to the school. It was agreed that the Neighbourhood Plan should continue to seek allocation of part of the Glebelands field adjacent to the school for parking and a new safe pedestrian access to the school playing fields via an upgraded footpath CRUD7 with a new pedestrian bridge over the Swillbrook. To that end school and church representatives will liaise with landowners and the local MP while the NP group will continue to liaise with Wiltshire Council via Councillor Berry.

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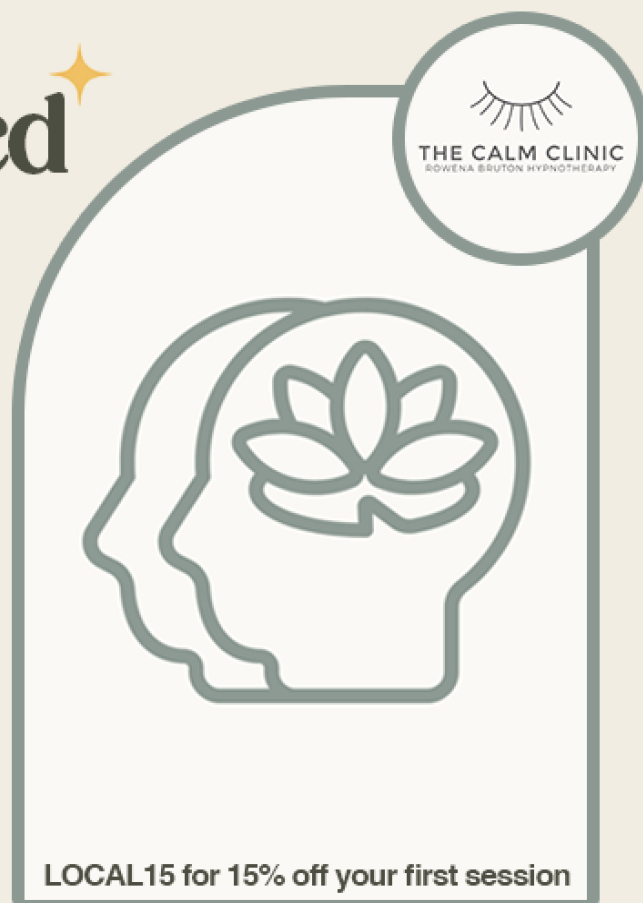
