Crudwell Village Hall

Discussions continue as we determine the most important areas of the village hall and recreation ground in which to invest.

We have just received first quotes for the much-needed resurfacing of the tennis courts and they're big. However, we could also take the opportunity to expand their usefulness, adding lines (and nets) for pickleball and basketball, for example. There are other things we could do to improve the overall outdoor environment, including more tree and wildflower planting, table tennis tables, a barbecue area, bird and bat boxes, and a zip wire. There's lots to think about so, while we continue our deliberations — and perhaps engage in more formal consultation with the community on what it would most like to see - we have a small appeal, not for money, but for time.

The hall is now once again very regularly booked for special events at the weekend, especially birthday parties for all ages. A very small team is currently responsible for opening and closing the hall for these bookings and we'd very much like to lighten the load if possible. There is a WhatsApp group of local volunteers to organise the handling of upcoming bookings. This is an invitation for more to join that group; with enough people, we would each need to assume the responsibility very rarely. Parish Clerk Vacancy

We are sorry that our Parish Clerk Caroline who joined us in August has unfortunately had to leave us due to personal reasons. We are therefore now commencing the process of recruiting a new post holder. The clerk's role is a vital one. It is a permanent position, 7 hours per week, working from home (with flexibility depending upon demand). The council meets at 7pm on the fourth Tuesday of the month, though attendance at additional meetings may be required. The Clerk's duties include:

Administering all parish council meetings, including producing agendas, minutes and relevant papers; recording and managing all income and expenditure and on-line bank account monitoring; managing emails and parish council correspondence; completing the annual internal and external audits and VAT claims; providing advice and guidance to councillors on statutory, legal and other matters; liaising with the Chair / Vice-Chair on Parish Council business.

Flood prevention and Crudwell Flood Action Group (FLAG) We remain committed to doing our best to ensure that all available steps are taken to mitigate flood risk in collaboration with Crudwell FLAG and are grateful for their substantial efforts. You may have noticed that we have now installed a depth gauge at the A429 road bridge which was useful in monitoring the speed of increase in the flow to giving us earlier warning of potential flooding during the November heavy rains. Neighbourhood Plan December

2031 Neighbourhood Plan Allocation; Tuners Lane

The Planning Application for this site which was allocated in the 2021 made Crudwell Neighbourhood Plan remains under consideration by Wiltshire Council.

2038 Neighbourhood Plan Review

IMPORTANT: POTENTIAL HOUSING SITES AND VILLAGE SPEED LIMIT

Our short survey to seek your opinions on the potential housing sites for allocation in the Plan is now available on our website at:

https://www.my-crudwell.org/2025/11/neighbourhood-plan-steering-group-informal-consultation

This is not at this stage a formal consultation, but we would value your informal views on the proposed allocations. We must allocate up to 39 new houses in Crudwell in order to meet the new Government Housing targets and if we do not do this and complete our new Neighbourhood Plan, we will be at serious risk of facing much larger unwanted speculative applications from developers. The sites proposed are:

Site A; a development of 25 homes at the north of Chapel Close.

Site B; a development of 14 homes on the current Carpenters Yard site.

Site C; a development of 40 homes on land to the South of Tetbury Lane between The Butts and the Village playing fields.

We have also taken this opportunity in the survey to seek your views about the possibility of reducing the village's speed limit to 20MPH, with an extension of the limit on the A429 to the South of the village beyond the Murcott junction. These proposals are currently under consideration by the Parish Council in response to concerns expressed in previous consultations.

We are pleased to say that response to the survey questionnaire has been encouraging to date with 68 responses to date. We do encourage you to give us your views and the survey remains open until the 30th of November 2025. We will publish a summary of the results in the New Year.

Consultation with statutory bodies is currently taking place in respect of the Strategic Environmental Assessment required for our proposed site allocations. The bodies contacted include Historic England, Natural England and the Environment Agency. The document which will form an important part of the new Neighbourhood Plan and will help inform the selection of our sites for housing.

A further meeting with the representatives of the Parish Council, School Governors, Headteacher, Crudwell Church and residents took place on the 19th of November. The group has been formed to investigate and take forward potential measures to tackle the congestion and hazards caused by parking at school drop off and pick up times.

Neighbourhood Plan cont'd

It is hoped that an additional parking facility for the school and parents can be made available in part of the Glebelands field adjacent to the school. The scheme includes the provision of a new safe pedestrian access to the school playing fields via an upgraded footpath CRUD7 with a new pedestrian bridge over the Swillbrook. Discussions with Wiltshire Council and landowners are now taking place in order to assess the viability and costs of the project and a draft plan of the scheme is being prepared.
