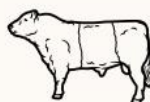

CO-OPTED GOVERNOR VACANCY

CRUDWELL CHURCH OF ENGLAND PRIMARY SCHOOL

Crudwell Church of England Primary School's governing body has a vacancy for a Co-opted Governor. If you are interested in using your skills, experience and time to help make a positive contribution to the school and its pupils, then we would love to hear from you.

Enthusiasm, commitment and the time to get involved are the key qualities that we're looking for. However, it would be desirable if you also have a background in finance, but this is not essential if you have other skills and experience that will add value to the governing body.

What is a school governor?

School governors have a varied and important role in helping our school run effectively. They have four core functions:

- Ensuring clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction for the school.
- Holding the Headteacher to account for the educational performance of the school and its pupils, and the effective and efficient performance management of staff.
- Overseeing the financial performance of the school and making sure its money is well spent.
- Ensuring the voices of stakeholders are heard.

The governor role is strategic rather than operational. Governors don't get involved with the day to day running of a school, instead supporting and challenging the school's leadership team to drive school improvement. They champion the work the school does.

If you join our governing body, you will serve for a four-year term. Being a school governor is a rewarding experience, but it does require a reasonable time commitment. There are six governing body meetings each year, and governors serve on at least one of our three committees which all meet four to six times a year. You will need to dedicate time to be an effective governor. However, excellent support and development opportunities are available.

Being a school governor is a commitment and a responsibility but offers you the chance to see first-hand the impact you can make in improving education for the whole community. You'll have the ability to influence policies and ways of working, truly shaping the school's future for the better.

How do I apply?

If you are interested in applying to be a Co-opted Governor at Crudwell Church of England Primary School, please complete the application form on the school website (<https://www.crudwellprimary.co.uk/vacancies>) and email it to clerk@crudwell.wilts.sch.uk.

In addition, either before or after the submitting an application, we would like you to have a discussion with the Chair or Vice Chair of Governors to establish that you fully understand the demands of the role and to answer any questions that you may have.

Anyone aged 18 or over can apply, except those legally barred from being a governor. You do not have to live in Crudwell or be a parent/carer of a pupil at the school.

Crudwell Church of England Primary School is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and young people and expects all staff and volunteers to share this commitment. The position is subject to satisfactory references and online searches, and a satisfactory enhanced Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) check for criminal convictions and suitability for working with children.

The deadline for applications is **Monday 12 January 2026**.

Crudwell CE Primary School

Term 2 has been fun-packed and full of learning!

Our younger children have performed brilliantly in their production of Secret Angels which was enjoyed by parents and carers and a wonderful start to our Christmas celebrations. We now eagerly await the EYFS class nativity at church on Friday. We would like to express our thanks to the Friends of Crudwell School for a wonderful and well-attended Christmas Fayre. Together with the online Winter Wonderland, extra funds to support school will go towards expanding our offer for children in a time when budgets are tight.

The whole school took a trip to The Barn Theatre in Cirencester to watch A Christmas Carol where the cast began by introducing themselves and explaining how all of the staging and special effects would work. Children and staff thoroughly enjoyed themselves and were fascinated to learn some of the tricks behind the production.

In Crudwell Primary all the children are organised into House Groups and this term Mrs Owen led a STEAM (science, technology, engineering, art and maths) day based around the story of the Three Billy Goats Gruff. Children worked in their House Groups to build a bridge that would hold the three goats and prevent the troll from catching them! Lots of fun and learning was had by all.

Crudwell Village Hall

Having spent more time discussing how we invest funds for the best outcomes for the whole community, the committee has agreed that the priority is a resurfacing of the tennis courts, as well as some work to turn them into a more fully functioning multi-sports facility. But there are other exciting plans too.

The tennis courts were built about 20 years ago and, notwithstanding a retreatment of the surface roughly ten years ago, is in sore need of an update. We're going to take the opportunity to resurface the courts but also install lines and movable nets and posts that, in combination, will support their use for basketball, netball, pickle ball, and five-a-side, as well as tennis. It's a big job and we'll need some clear weather, but there are other things we'll be exploring too, including the installation of outdoor table tennis tables in one of the cleared spaces near the hall and a zip wire at the bottom of the field. Meanwhile, plans for native, nature (and human) friendly planting continue. This time next year, we hope the space will be an even more active and pleasant space for us all.

Being the last update of 2025, I'd like to express my personal thanks to the whole committee who continue to dedicate precious time and energy to supporting and evolving the hall and its grounds - together they are all helping to leave it an even better place for the future.

2031 Neighbourhood Plan Allocation; Tuners Lane

The Planning Application for this site which was allocated in the 2021 made Crudwell Neighbourhood Plan remains under consideration by Wiltshire Council.

2038 Neighbourhood Plan Review

POTENTIAL HOUSING SITES AND VILLAGE SPEED LIMIT

- Many thanks to those of you who completed our survey to seek your opinions on the potential housing sites for allocation in the new Neighbourhood Plan. The survey has now closed; the results are being analysed and considered along with the technical evidence on sustainability and fit with our requirements for affordable housing and design. This work will produce a draft policy for site allocation in our developing plan which we will share with you in the next formal consultation, Regulation 14, which will take place early in the New Year.
- We must allocate up to 39 new houses in Crudwell in order to meet the new Government Housing targets and if we do not do this and complete our new Neighbourhood Plan, we will be at serious risk of facing much larger unwanted speculative applications from developers given the poor housing supply position of Wiltshire Council.
- Many of you also responded to the idea to seek a reduction in the speed limit through the village to 20 MPH. There was a mixed response with respondents marginally in favour of the proposal (55%). The Parish Council has also requested an extension of the limit on the A429 to the South of the village beyond the Murcott junction.
- A first draft of the Strategic Environmental Assessment required for our proposed site allocations has now been delivered to the working group for review. The document which will form an important part of the new Neighbourhood Plan will help inform the selection of our sites for housing.
- Further to our recent further meeting with the representatives of the Parish Council, School Governors, Headteacher, Crudwell Church and residents which took place on the 19th of November, there have been initial discussions with the landowners, the Diocese of Bristol. We are waiting for a response from the Diocese to the proposal to provide an additional parking facility for the school and parents in part of the Glebelands field adjacent to the school. The scheme is part of a plan for potential measures to tackle the congestion and safety hazards caused by parking at school drop off and pick up times. The scheme includes the provision of a new safe pedestrian access to the school playing fields via an upgraded footpath CRUD7 with a new pedestrian bridge over the Swillbrook.

Greetings from All Saints Church

That ache might just be a wake-up call from God.

As I found out last week, toothache is small compared to the rest of the body, yet when it flares up, it demands our full attention. We cannot ignore it. It interrupts our sleep, our meals, and our thoughts. The discomfort is disproportional and can ruin our whole day.

Perhaps we try initially to brave it out or hope that the ache will go away. Next, we might check out traditional methods of pain relief, like cold water rinses and clove oil or even some brandy. Numbing gel and paracetamol help, but they don't solve the problem. Pain points to something deeper beneath the surface and DIY fixes are unlikely to work. So, (forgive the pun), we 'bite the bullet' and seek out a professional. We contact the dentist.

In the same way, God sometimes allows discomfort in our lives to awaken us spiritually. What feels like pain or inconvenience may actually be His gentle nudge, reminding us to pause, reflect, and seek Him. There is a parallel truth to be seen here. Just as we try to find a dentist to bring healing to our body, we are invited to seek out the Great Physician who restores our souls. Again and again, the Bible invites us to bring our pain and burdens to Christ, rather than struggling with them or hiding them (Matthew 11 vs 28).

We can learn to recognize pain as an invitation, not just an interruption. The ache is not meant to destroy us, but to direct us - to draw us closer to the One who offers lasting peace and wholeness. Psalm 147:3 says, *'He heals the broken-hearted and binds up their wounds.'* Christians down through the ages have experienced this.

After your visit, the dentist will probably encourage you to adopt healthy daily care habits. Brushing twice a day and booking in for checkups help prevent future toothache. So too I encourage you at the start of this New Year to implement some beneficial spiritual habits.

Pause each day and give thanks for your blessings.

Pray, *"Where Lord are you using discomfort to get my attention right now?"*

Pass over that burden and pain to Jesus. Trust him to deal with it. He is able.

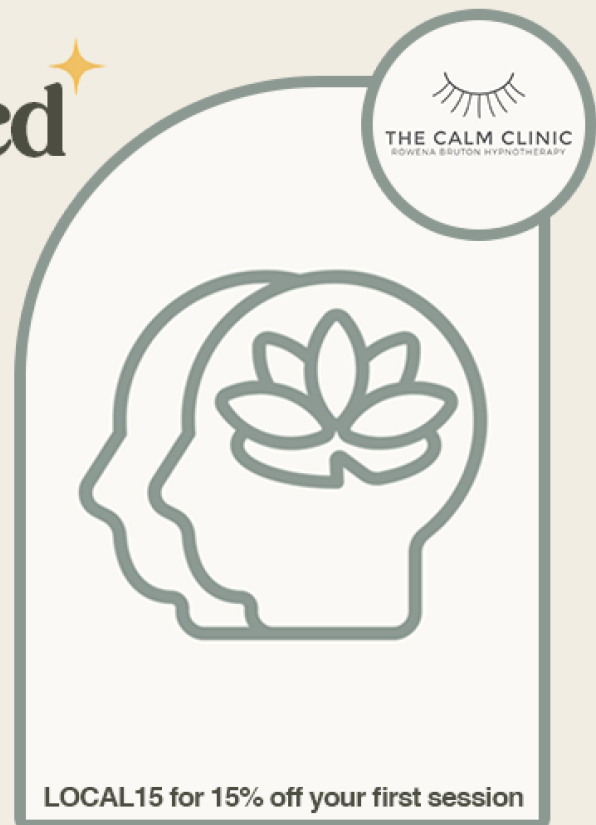
