## Crudwell CE Primary School

We have six core school values: Responsibility, Respect, Trust, Perseverance, Creativity and Teamwork.

This term, we are working on our value Responsibility. The Year 6 children have been planning and taking Collective Worship each week and it has been wonderful to see them taking on this responsibility in such a positive way. We feel that it is very important to give children responsibilities at school as personal development is embedded in our school vision of 'Roots to grow and wings to fly'.

We run elections in September each year, where children campaign for different positions of responsibility across the school. Many of the roles are given to children in Year 6 but there are other roles given throughout the school. We have a School Council who meet to discuss and plan for school events or raise money for the school or charities. Currently School Council are planning for Crudwell's Got Talent (our in-school talent show) which will take place at the end of the month.

Historically School Council have many achievements; one of the most significant has been campaigning for Dress Down Fridays. Children questioned why their parents could 'dress down' on a Friday and they had to wait for a charity fund-raising day. The School Council ran a campaign collecting names on a petition, wrote to the headteacher and even presented their argument at a school governors meeting. The Headteacher and governors were so impressed that they agreed to having 'Dress Down' Friday for the first Friday of every month and it still remains in place today. What will this year's School Council achieve? We will have to wait and see!

# Parish Council February

## Parish Clerk

We are pleased to inform you that we have a new Parish Clerk and Responsible Financial Officer following the required recruitment process. He is Theo Edge who lives locally and is an experienced Parish Clerk who began working for us in December and attended our January meeting. Cllrs Bullock and Butcher who did excellent work in maintaining business continuity following our previous clerk's resignation can now go back to their day jobs with our gratitude! **Parish Council Meetings:** The last meeting of the Council took place on Tuesday the 13th of January. This was a particularly important meeting where we agreed our budget for the next financial year and set our precept requirement from Wiltshire Council. It was necessary to make a small increase in the precept this year due to the general cost of living increases and also to ensure that we have sufficient reserves to meet our statutory duties and other essential work including maintenance of the play park and our estate. Our reserves have been substantially reduced during the current year through extensive flood preventative work on the Swillbrook and essential tree maintenance. The 26/27 budget will be made available on our website when the precept has been confirmed.

# Neighbourhood Plan February

## **2038 Neighbourhood Plan Review- Regulation 14 progress and timescale.**

Work is progressing to a conclusion with the draft Regulation 14 submission which includes findings of the brief survey to seek parishioners' opinions. The final draft will recommend site allocation to meet the required 39 houses to meet current Government housing requirements for Crudwell. The draft allocation will be made from the sites proposed which are:

Site A; a development of 25 homes at the north of Chapel Close.

Site B; a development of 14 homes on the current Carpenters Yard site.

Site C; a development of 40 homes on land to the South of Tetbury Lane between The Butts and the Village playing fields.

The draft also includes policies on local businesses including Cotswold Airport and Kemble Business Park, Drainage and Flooding, Highway Safety, the Primary School, and the Crudwell Design Code.

The final version of the Strategic Environmental Assessment is due shortly from Aecom which will enable the draft to be finalised ready for NP Steering Group and Parish Council approval in during February. Formal regulation 14 consultation will begin at the end of February for the statutory period of six weeks. You will be able to comment and respond to the consultation via a form on our website and paper copies will also be made available in the Post Office, Farm Shop and our pubs.

Following the consultation, all responses will be reviewed and taken into account in developing the next stages of the planning process which will include inspection by a Government Inspector and finally a referendum where you will be asked to vote for acceptance of the plan. A completed plan will ensure that by allocating the required 39 homes in Crudwell by 2039 we continue to have protection from much larger developments and can also benefit from additional funding for our village.

A meeting took place in December with myself, Cllr. Kaner and a representative of the Diocese of Bristol to discuss the possibility of acquiring part of the Glebe Field adjacent to the school for additional parent and staff parking. The diocese is currently undertaking a review of land and property which includes the Glebe Field and the representative agreed to give a response to our proposal following discussions with their land agent. When the response has been received, we will convene a further meeting with the representatives of the Parish Council, School Governors, Headteacher, Crudwell Church and residents. The scheme includes the provision of a new safe pedestrian access to the school playing fields via an upgraded footpath CRUD7 with a new pedestrian bridge over the Swillbrook. This part of the scheme is not dependent upon approval by the Diocese.




