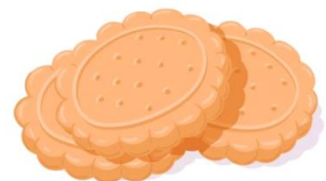

Strawberry Fayre Shortbread

200g plain flour
50g cornflour
175g softened butter and diced
75g caster sugar



Put both flours, the butter and sugar into a food processor and whizz until all the ingredients come together to make a soft dough. Roll out onto a lightly floured board and cut into rounds using a 2 1/2 inch cutter. Prick all over and place on a baking sheet. Cook in the middle of the oven set at 150 degrees for 20 -25 minutes.

The Infant Thames Programme supports volunteers across the Upper Thames to monitor river health and develop restoration projects. It will provide training and equipment, and coordinate activities such as water quality testing, flow monitoring, and outfall surveys.



Locally, the Infant Thames Action Group (ITAG) is focusing on water quality around Ashton Keynes from the Thames Head to Cricklade and beyond, alongside activities such as River Fly monitoring and litter picks. With growing interest across the area, nearby communities, including **Crudwell Flood Action Group**, are also getting involved.

The aim is to better understand pressures on the river, from low water levels to pollution, and to involve local people in protecting and restoring this important stretch of the Thames. *Stay tuned for more updates.*

Neighbourhood Plan May

Regulation 14 represents a crucial phase in the development of the new draft Crudwell Neighbourhood Plan. This public consultation provides an opportunity for Crudwell residents to share their views on the proposed Plan.

The Plan outlines two proposed housing allocations that have been thoughtfully chosen to ensure that future developments are managed at an appropriate scale, with suitable design and affordability, while aligning with new Government targets. Without a Neighbourhood Plan in place, the community may be exposed to the risk of large-scale developments similar to those seen in neighbouring areas.

The updated Neighbourhood Plan also covers policies related to Local Business, Drainage and Flooding, Highway Safety, and the Primary School.

Greetings from All Saints Church

Disappointment can be very hard to deal with - it comes in all shapes and sizes, from small let-downs to great, crushing blows that change everything.

It can be especially painful when all those around seem to be flourishing, when it's completely unexpected or, worse still, of our own making. It can lead to feeling like we aren't enough. It can also feel like God has let us down.

I have found myself in this position – thinking I was on the right track, thinking I was doing all I could, thinking I was making progress, until suddenly a door didn't open. I felt devastated, like my journey was over. With the help and advice of my very wise sister, I was able to look at the situation with fresh eyes and see alternative ways to move forward, and it has reminded me of something I often preach but in that moment of disappointment, I had lost sight of ...

We make God so small

We see the problems and solutions of life on an earthly scale, and it can be very hard to accept that God sees a much greater picture than we ever could. We struggle to accept that a solution might be in the future, out of sight, or come from a very unlikely place.

Jesus is clear about God's approach to our concerns.

“Do not worry about your life. Consider the ravens: They do not sow or reap. They have no storeroom or barn; yet God feeds them. And how much more valuable you are than birds! See how the flowers of the field grow. They do not labour or spin. Yet I tell you that not even Solomon in all his splendour was dressed like one of these. If that is how God clothes the grass of the field, which is here today and tomorrow is thrown into the fire, will he not much more clothe you? Who of you by worrying can add a single hour to your life? Do not worry about these things - your Father knows that you need them. But seek his kingdom, and these things will be given to you as well.”

When we are in the depths of our disappointment, that truth can seem very far off. But our God is a great big God. He loves his children and wants to do what's best for them. He is also the absolute king of making something beautiful out of something ugly, so we can be comforted that, whatever situation we find ourselves in, these things are true:

God wants only good things for us.

He can see a future we cannot even imagine.

Even if we are on the wrong path, God can help us get back on track.

Even the most cruelly painful situations can be transformed by God.

If he really is Creator of the Universe, High King of heaven, Lord and Saviour, our problems are probably not beyond His scope to solve!

That last one was the decider for me – if I truly believe all I say I believe about him. I will hand my broken pieces to him in full confidence that he can put me back together in an even more beautiful way.

Life will never be without disappointments, but however keen the pain, God is with us in those moments, and we are freely and warmly encouraged to lean on him – He is more than big enough to shoulder our cares, more than capable of transforming them, and loves us more than enough to want to.

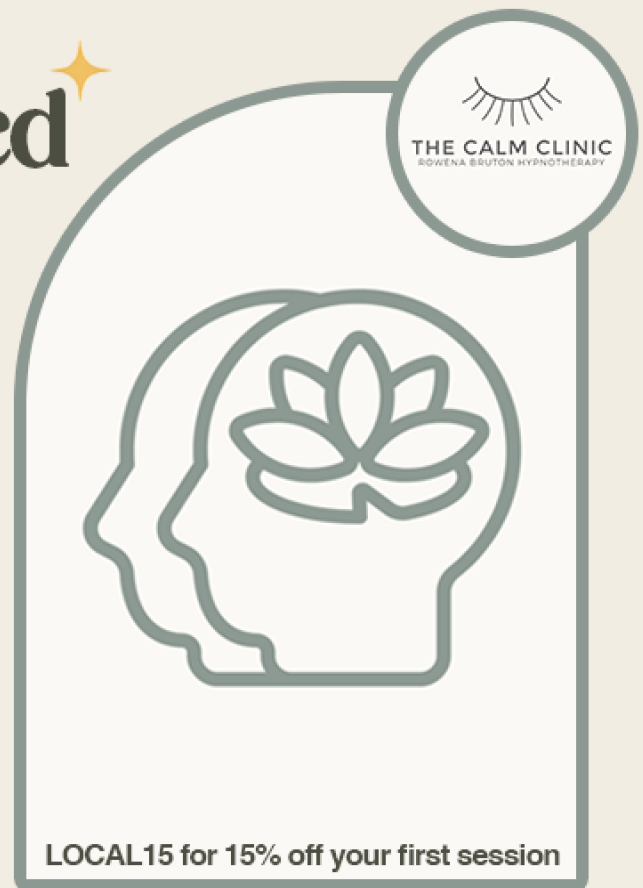

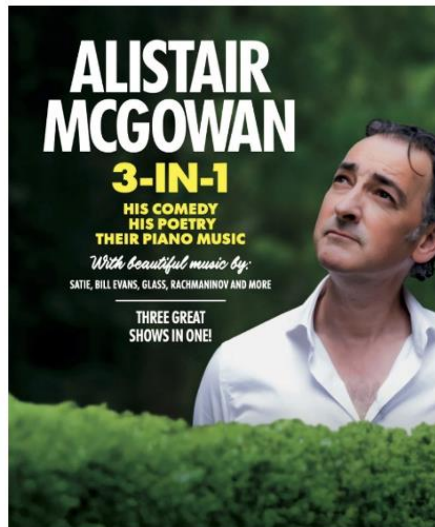
