# Parish Council June

**Parish Council Meetings:** The most recent full Council meeting took place on Tuesday, 23rd June. This was the Annual General Meeting of the Council where officers were elected. Councillor Roy Hamilton-Lambley was re-elected as Chairman and Councillor Peter Gilchriest as Vice Chairman. Councillor roles and responsibilities were agreed and may be found on our website. The next full Parish Council meeting is scheduled for Tuesday the 28<sup>th</sup> of July 2026 at 7:00 pm in Crudwell Village Hall. Members of the public are welcome to attend, with the opportunity to speak during the initial minutes of each meeting.

**Local Crime:** There have, unfortunately, recently been a number of burglaries and thefts in the local area.

- A break-in at outbuildings in Chedglow and an attempted theft of tools and garden equipment
- Theft of a Range Rover from Chedglow
- A break in and theft of cash at Murcott Farm Shop
- Theft of heating oil from a house in The Butts
- Theft of two trailers from the yard on the A429 south of the village
- Most recently theft of 16,000 Litres of diesel oil from Carpenters Yard

This means we must all be extremely vigilant and mindful of the risks to our property and possessions. Many of us have invested in security alarms and CCTV cameras which can be used to identify intruders and to share information with the Police. While bespoke installations can be expensive, cheaper DIY solutions are available. We do have to be increasingly vigilant, while insurances will offset some losses, this inevitably leads to an increase in premiums.

**Flood prevention and Crudwell Flood Action Group (FLAG):** The council continues to work closely with FLAG and two councillors are members of the group. FLAG has recently also been active in arranging flood warning training for an additional eight volunteers to share the work of the flood warden in Crudwell. Having volunteers with specific local responsibilities will help ensure that help is close at hand in future flooding emergencies. The Parish Council is grateful to FLAG and to the volunteers for their commitment to our great unity spirit in Crudwell.

# Greetings from All Saints Church

## Bricked up Doorways

“Then one of them (i.e.1 of the 10 lepers), when he saw that he was healed, turned back, praising God with a loud voice. He bowed down at Jesus’ feet and thanked him.” Luke 17 vs 15-16

When I first arrived here, I was intrigued by the two holes cut through these large pillars, either side of the chancel in Crudwell Church. I hadn’t seen anything quite like them before. They’re called ‘hagioscopes,’ sometimes known as ‘squints.’ The term comes from the ancient Greek ‘hagio,’ meaning ‘holy,’ and ‘scope’ to ‘see.’ They were designed to give worshippers, if they were sat behind a column, a direct line of sight to the altar. I theorised that the bricked in door in the north aisle, must be a ‘Leper Door.’ The belief was that small doorways in churches, were designed to allow lepers to look inside and observe the Communion from a distance. It is appealing to think that this may be such a door.

But modern historians argue that many of these doors probably served simply as an entrance for the priest or, even more simply, for ventilation. They caused unwelcome drafts and required additional security so many were permanently sealed up when they fell out of daily use.

The bricked in door and the possible connection to lepers in the past, links to the story of the 10 lepers in Luke’s Gospel. Lepers remained on the fringes of a community, shunned by everyone, because of their infectious condition. Their disease keeps them at a distance, so, standing some way off, they holler at Jesus:

‘Jesus, Master. Have mercy on us.’

Their cry has a profound element of hope in it. They had to shout at Jesus in order to make themselves heard, but Jesus didn't shout back at them! He goes up close, and speaks to them, treating them with all the respect that any human being deserves. They obey his instructions to show themselves to the priests and are made clean. I don’t think we can imagine their shared happiness!

Only one of them returns to thank and praise Jesus. The Samaritan, on seeing what has happened to him, is filled with gratitude, with awe – that strange mixture of fear and wonder and joy. We’re not told why the others didn’t return. Perhaps, in the sheer moment of wonder, they were so caught up in their changed world, that they simply didn’t think of coming back to say “Thank you” to Jesus. Whatever the reason, they lost sight of Jesus. Maybe we too have sat down metaphorically in a place, where we no longer have a clear view of Jesus?

The fantastic news is that Christ never loses sight of us. He comes to talk with us quietly, privately, and to great effect. Like the lepers, we have been ransomed, healed, restored, forgiven....We have been brought into fellowship and family with God. That is wonderful.

Let this moment be a reminder to us to stop, look, call out, receive and notice what we have received, to give thanks, and praise God.
