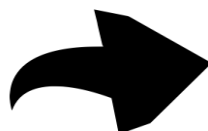

Crudwell Village Hall

While the committee takes a well-earned break from meetings during August, the amount of activity at the hall is, if anything, growing.

During the summer, roof works will be taking place to fix leaks before the rain returns, assuming it will eventually.

The new-look multi-sports facility is in regular use, which is wonderful to see, though the ongoing heat storms have meant periods where they have had to be shut to protect the surface in its early months.

With a potential pump track now fully on the shelf as a sensible investment, we're instead planning to install a zip wire in the space at the bottom of the field. Investigations will begin when we meet again in early September.

And there are some significant free events taking place at the hall in the next two months. First, local architectural designer Gary Lawes is thankfully repeating his talk on how people can learn from his own experiences and experiments to drive down their home energy costs. This time though, actor Jason Durr (Heartbeat, Casualty, and more) will be there to introduce him! You can find details in this edition of WOIC.

Second, and especially thanks to a couple of volunteers from Friends of Crudwell School following last month's issue, we have set a date for our own screening of the People's Emergency Briefing. The screening aims to bring people together to hear the evidence on the climate and nature crisis for themselves and discuss how to respond. This will take place at the hall from 4pm-6pm on **Saturday, 12th September**.

CSCF: Strengthening Security and Community Awareness in Crudwell

Crudwell is a close-knit rural community and like many villages across the Cotswolds, it faces increasing pressure from organised rural crime, travelling offenders, and opportunistic thefts targeting farms, outbuildings, vehicles, and isolated properties. While the village benefits from strong neighbourly ties and an active Parish Council, the speed at which incidents now unfold means communities need faster, smarter ways to share information.

The **Cotswolds Security Collaboration Forum (CSCF)** was created to meet exactly that need.

CSCF is a **free, community-driven intelligence network** connecting residents, farms, estates, small businesses, and rural organisations across the region. When something happens - suspicious activity, attempted theft, a vehicle scouting lanes, or a confirmed crime - members can “light the beacon” and alert others immediately. This rapid sharing of detail helps neighbouring communities stay ahead of offenders who often move quickly from village to village.

Crudwell sits on key routes frequently used by travelling criminals, making early warnings especially valuable. Recent incidents in surrounding parishes show how quickly information can prevent further losses when shared promptly and accurately.

The Forum is not a replacement for Neighbourhood Watch or the Police - it **supports and strengthens** both. CSCF focuses on practical, real-time intelligence: vehicle descriptions, timings, behaviour patterns, and location-specific risks. Members also receive guidance on rural security, crime trends, and protective measures relevant to farms, equine businesses, workshops, and private homes.

Joining takes less than a minute, and there is **no cost, no obligation, and no public posting**. It is simply a secure way for local people to help protect one another.

Crudwell has always been a community that looks out for its neighbours. CSCF builds on that tradition - giving residents the tools to stay informed, stay connected, and stay ahead of those who target rural areas.

Parish Council & Neighbourhood Plan August

Parish Council Meetings: The most recent full Council meeting took place on Tuesday, 28th of July. Minutes from all meetings, as well as the agenda for upcoming sessions, are available on our website: <https://www.crudwell-pc.gov.uk/category/minutes/> We are pleased to have co-opted parishioner Nicola Bailey to the Council which means that we have a full complement of nine councillors and there are therefore no vacancies. The next full Parish Council meeting is scheduled for Tuesday the 25th of August 2026 at 7:00 pm in Crudwell Village Hall. Members of the public are welcome to attend, with the opportunity to speak during the initial ten minutes of each meeting.

Minor repairs have been completed on the play equipment and outdoor gym at the village hall recreation ground. Two swings are temporarily unavailable due to broken seats, but replacements are on order and should be installed soon. If you notice any issues with the outdoor gym or children's play equipment, please contact the Parish Clerk at parish.clerk@crudwell-pc.gov.uk.

Flood prevention and Crudwell Flood Action Group (FLAG): The council continues to work closely with Crudwell FLAG and three councillors are members of the group and report to the Council as a standing item on the agenda. We are grateful to FLAG volunteers for their work to help keep our waterways clear. Speed Limits Survey: We are grateful to those of you who responded to the recent survey on speed limits in our village with your views on their effectiveness, potential reduction and extension to south of the village on the A429. The results of the survey, which are being reported to the Parish Council shortly will help to inform our recommendations to Wiltshire Council. We will report the findings in the next edition of this journal.

Neighbourhood Plan News: Public Consultation - Draft 2020–2038 Crudwell Neighbourhood Plan (Regulation 14) We have now received the formal response to the draft Plan from Wiltshire Council which enables us to complete the next version for submission. Much of this work is technical, requires input from Council Officials and others and is therefore time consuming. It is though, particularly important that the Plan is robust and acceptable to a Government Examiner in order to help us prevent large unwanted speculative planning applications at a time when Wiltshire Council has a significant housing reserve shortfall and no Local Plan. Further updates will be shared in due course.

FLAG volunteers have cleared and removed weeds from key streams and ditches in the parish in recent weeks including watercourses on the Village Green and in front of the school, the Swill Brook on Post Office Green and along parts of Tuners and Rommel Lanes, and the Butts stream next to the Butts play area.

Residents with a watercourse on their property including along their boundary are encouraged to be prepared for the rainy season and should contact the FLAG if they need any advice or help.

Managing watercourses isn't just about volunteering inside the village, and many farmers and landowners go to much greater effort to take care of watercourses and the natural environment around us. NGOs, charities, and initiatives that support farmers in our area include FWAG SW, the Cotswold Rivers Trust, Wiltshire Wildlife Trust, and the new Western Forest. These groups listen to farmers and connect them with funding opportunities for nature-based solutions, including Natural Flood Management and Landscape Recovery. Farmers and landowners can contact these groups directly or can contact the FLAG to explore shared community concerns like habitat restoration and flooding.

With the help of the Rivers Trust, we are looking at how Sustainable Drainage can be adopted in a rural parish like ours. For householders, this is often about capturing rainfall not just into water butts, but also specially designed planters. For community buildings like the school or the village hall, it might be about green roofs, rain gardens, and tree pits. For Wiltshire Council it could and should be about modern approaches to rainfall management alongside our roads and footpaths. We are in the early days of exploring this, and if you could help pursue funding or pilot a project, please join the FLAG.

Wiltshire Council's Principal Drainage Engineer recently confirmed that he will return to Crudwell with a colleague to walk around and review drainage issues. The FLAG prepared the list of issues last year and will be showing locations at all ends of the village where kerbside improvements might be made.

Greetings from All Saints Church

Coping with the inevitable changes we all face in our lifetime Whether we welcome them or not, changes come along and affect our lives! Some of the changes are barely discernible, and we take them in our stride easily, whilst others will have a profound, ongoing impact. Changes in our personal relationships, employment (or the lack of it), finances, retirement, moving homes, starting a family, children growing up and leaving home, ageing, bereavement – all these factors play their part in changing our lives, just as the seasons change throughout the year.

God's Word promises that seasons change. When change comes our way, it is helpful to remind ourselves that all seasons will pass. God is still with us, and he will carry us through these changing seasons. Life might change, but God and his Son Jesus never will. Find peace in this promise. He offers peace in the shelter of his wings. The writer of Hebrews states that Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever.
